TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

“Which was the greatest unrecorded suffering of Jesus?”

On August 20, we will celebrate the memorial of St. Bernard of Clairvaux, and I happened to read an article this week from *Aleteia Magazine* with a very fascinating topic, and I want to share some points with you.

When we think of the Passion of Jesus, we tend to think about his five wounds in his body, but there's one that tends to be forgotten; that is the question the mystic St. Bernard asked Jesus: “which was his greatest unrecorded suffering?” and our Lord answered him: “I had on My Shoulder while I bore My Cross on the Way of Sorrows, a grievous Wound that was more painful than the others, and which is not recorded by men. Honor this Wound with thy devotion, and I will grant thee whatsoever thou dost ask through its virtue and merit. And in regard to all those who shall venerate this Wound, I will remit to them all their venial sins and will no longer remember their mortal sins.”

Another great saint known by many who for more than 50 years bore the wounds of Christ (Stigmata) on his hands and feet, is Padre Pio. “It is reported that once in a very interesting conversation with Karol Wojtyla, the future pope, St. John Paul II, Wojtyla asked Padre Pio which of his wounds caused the most pain; and Padre Pio replied, it was his shoulder wound, which no one knows about and has never been cured or treated.”

During this time of pandemic, frustrations, uncertainties, desperation, etc., may we bear the cross on our shoulders in atonement for our sins of the whole world.

WHY PRAY?

The "foreigners" as Isaiah calls them, the "Gentiles" as Paul calls them, or the "Canaanites" as Matthew calls them are called to worship the one true God in prayer. As we listen to today's readings, perhaps we are tempted to ask: Why pray? The question is rhetorical; it is tantamount to asking why should friends talk to one another or people in love kiss one another. Prayer is a way of relating to God, a way of talking to God. The apostles had the opportunity to talk to Jesus in the flesh. We have the opportunity to talk to Jesus Christ in prayer. Our relationship with him must be enthusiastic; it cannot be faint-hearted. John Donne, a fifteenth-century poet, knew what the qualities of good prayer were. Donne asks God to treat him differently from most Christians. The poet does not want God to merely "knock, breathe, shine, and seek to mend," but also to "break, blow, burn, and make me new" (Holy Sonnets, XIV).

It takes a dynamic faith on our part to come to God in prayer. As Jesus once said, "Knock and the door will be opened to you" (Matthew 7:7). It may take pounding the door down, but if we are as persistent as the woman in today's Gospel, the results will follow.

Keep in mind when coming to Mass

Our Churches in the Archdiocese of Newark, and our own Parish of St. Joseph's of the Palisades:

- Fully in accord with the directives of our governor of New Jersey, and our Archbishop Cardinal Tobin the following are the guidelines in order to attend Mass and ensure that our church building is safe for all.

Daily Mass:

With strict guidelines, and if fully prepared to do so, parishes of the Archdiocese, **may** open churches with the **required guidelines:**

1. ***Not more than 100*** people may attend Mass at any one time.
 2. All must wear ***masks***;
 3. All must maintain ***six feet of separation*** from one another;
 4. ***Communion distributed only in the hand.***
 5. ***Those who may be vulnerable to the virus, those 60+ years old, recently or chronically ill, etc., encouraged to stay home and view Mass through social media.***
- **HERE AT ST. JOSEPH'S: Daily Mass for limited numbers of people:**
English Mass at 8:30 a.m. on Monday, Wednesday and Friday
Spanish Mass at 8:30 a.m. on Tuesday and Thursday, and Saturday at 9:00 a.m., Daily at 7:00 p.m.

Note: We suggest early arrival; when **100** people have arrived the doors must be closed.

Note also: Confessions at 6:00 p.m. daily.

• **SUNDAY MASS:**

With the same guidelines, but with STRICT CONTROL OF NUMBERS, Sunday Masses will be held **HERE AT ST. JOSEPH**

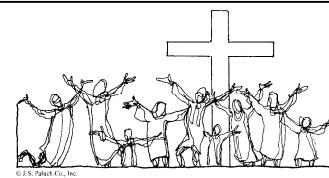

"¿Cuál fue el mayor sufrimiento no registrado de Jesús?"

El 20 de agosto celebraremos el memorial de San Bernand de Clairvaux, y esta semana leí un artículo de la revista Aleteia con un tema muy fascinante, y quiero compartir algunos puntos con ustedes.

Otro gran santo conocido por muchos que durante más de 50 años llevó las heridas de Cristo (Stigmata) en sus manos y pies, es Padre Pio. "Se informa que una vez en una conversación muy interesante con Karol Wojtyla, el futuro Papa San Juan Pablo II, Wojtyla le preguntó a Padre Pio cuál de sus heridas le causó más dolor; y el Padre Pio respondió: "Era su herida del hombro, que nadie sabe y nunca ha sido curada o tratada."
