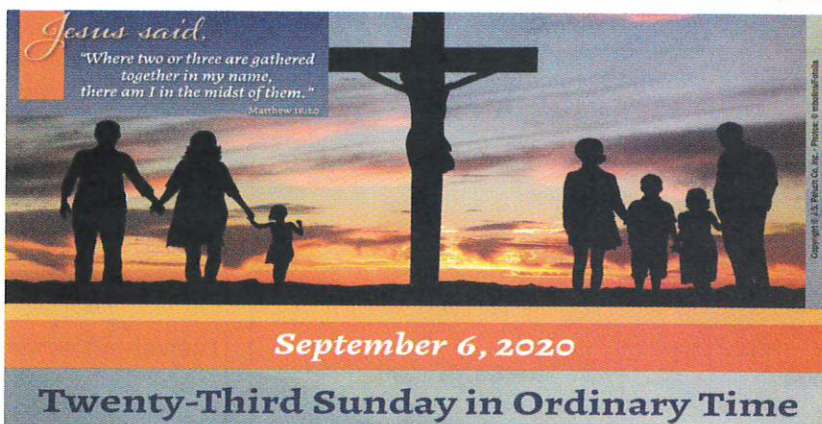

Scott Hahn, the well-known biblical scholar and Catholic, speaks of abandonment and doubt: Following God's call, Jeremiah feels abandoned, as we might in our own time and our own vocation. Preaching His Word has brought him only derision and reproach. But God does not deceive, and Jeremiah knows this. God tests the just, and disciplines His children through their sufferings and trials. What Jeremiah learns, Jesus states explicitly in the Gospel. To follow Him is to take up a cross, to deny yourself-your priorities, preferences, and comforts. It is to be willing to give it all up, even life itself, for the sake of His gospel. As Paul says in the Epistle, we have to join ourselves to the passion of Christ, to offer our bodies, our whole being, as living sacrifices to God. By His Cross, Jesus has shown us what Israel's sacrifices of animals were meant to teach: we owe to God all that we have. As it was for Jeremiah, the cross is a stumbling block for Peter. This too is our natural temptation, to refuse to believe that our sufferings play a necessary part in God's plan. That's how people think, Jesus tells us. But we are called to the renewal of our mind, to think as God thinks, to will what He wills. In the Mass, we once again offer ourselves as perfect and pleasing sacrifices of praise. We bless Him as we live, confident that we will find our lives in losing them, that with the riches of His banquet, our souls will be satisfied.

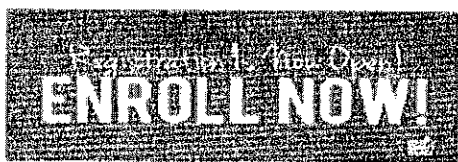

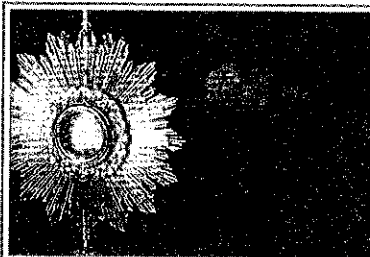

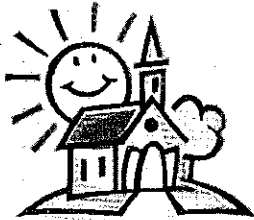

Keep in mind when coming to Mass

Our Churches in the Archdiocese of Newark, and our own Parish of St. Joseph's of the Palisades:

- Fully in accord with the directives of our governor of New Jersey, and our Archbishop Cardinal Tobin the following are the guidelines in order to attend Mass and ensure that our church building is safe for all.

Daily Mass:

With strict guidelines, and if fully prepared to do so, parishes of the Archdiocese, **may** open churches with the **required guidelines:**

1. **Not more than 150** people may attend Mass at any one time.
 2. All must wear **masks**;
 3. All must maintain **six feet of separation** from one another;
 4. **Communion distributed only in the hand.**
 5. Those who may be vulnerable to the virus, **those 60+ years old, recently or chronically ill, etc., encouraged to stay home** and view Mass through social media.
- **HERE AT ST. JOSEPH'S: Daily Mass for limited numbers of people:**
English Mass at 8:30 a.m. on Monday, Wednesday and Friday
Spanish Mass at 8:30 a.m. on Tuesday and Thursday, and Saturday at 9:00 a.m., Daily at 7:00 p.m.

Note: We suggest early arrival; when 100 people have arrived the doors must be closed.

Note also: Confessions at 6:00 p.m. daily.

• SUNDAY MASS:

With the same guidelines, but with STRICT CONTROL OF NUMBERS, Sunday Masses will be held **HERE AT ST. JOSEPH**

Reflexión del Domingo

Scott Hahn, el conocido erudito bíblico y católico, habla de abandono y duda: Siguiendo el llamado de Dios, Jeremías se siente abandonado, como podríamos hacer en nuestro tiempo y en nuestra propia vocación. Predicar su Palabra le ha traído solo burla y reproche. Pero Dios no engaña, y Jeremías lo sabe. Dios prueba a los justos, y disciplina a sus hijos a través de sus sufrimientos y pruebas. Lo que Jeremías aprende, Jesús declara explícitamente en el Evangelio. Seguirlo es tomar una cruz, negarse a sí mismo, sus prioridades, preferencias y comodidades. Es estar dispuesto a darlo todo, incluso la vida misma, por el bien de su evangelio. Como dice Pablo en la Epístola, tenemos que unirnos a la pasión de Cristo, para ofrecer nuestros cuerpos, nuestro ser entero, como sacrificios vivos a Dios. Por Su cruz, Jesús nos ha mostrado lo que los sacrificios de animales de Israel tenían que enseñar: Debemos a Dios todo lo que tenemos. Como lo fue para Jeremías, la cruz es un obstáculo para Pedro. Esta es también nuestra tentación natural, negarse a creer que nuestros sufrimientos desempeñan un papel necesario en el plan de Dios. Así es como la gente piensa, Jesús nos dice. Pero estamos llamados a la renovación de nuestra mente, a pensar como Dios piensa, a hacer lo que él quiere. En la Misa, nos ofrecemos una vez más como sacrificios perfectos y agradables de alabanza. Lo bendecimos mientras vivimos, confiados en que encontraremos nuestras vidas al perderlas, que con las riquezas de su banquete, nuestras almas estarán satisfechas.

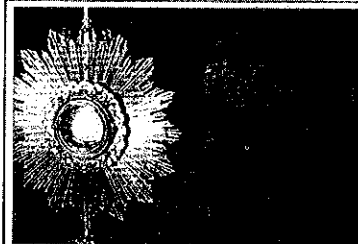
