Peter asked,
"Lord, how often
must I forgive?
As many as
seven times?"

Matthew 18:21

The subject of fraternal correction is a matter of great importance, and somehow it is reflected again in what we read in today's Gospel of Saint Matthew. Last week the Lord invited us to correct our neighbor with charity, love and great discretion; to avoid murmurings and events that can damage the reputation of the brother who has done something wrong.

Following in this same topic, This Sunday we read: "Peter came forward and asked Jesus: «Lord, if my brother

offends me, how many times do I have to forgive him? Up to seven times? Jesus answers him: "I do not tell you up to seven times, but up to seventy times seven." *Mt. 18: 21-22*. Forgiving someone who has offended us, or who has done something against us, is something that costs us a lot and unfortunately we only want to do until we have taken revenge.

This kind of attitude disfigures in it's totally what Jesus asks of us in his evangelizing message: "I give you this new commandment: That you love one another just as I have loved you". *John 13:34*. The readings for this weekend are a clear call of attention from God to each one of us, that, believing ourselves better than others, we take the liberty of judging and condemning those who have offended us. To others we condemned very easily for their wrongdoings, but when it comes to ourselves; when we have fallen into bad judgments, or have done something bad, we try to justify ourselves in a thousand ways, in order to feel good, or to be forgiven; showing others something that we are not.

If we want to be forgiven by our heavenly Father, we must reconsider our way of acting in the face of the sin or faults of the others, especially when that sin or fault affects me. It is difficult, but the Lord calls us to sacrifice, but more than that; He calls us to love and be compassionate towards others. Let's remember the words we pray more than once every day in the Our Father prayer. "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us."

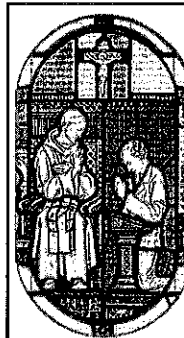

Keep in mind when coming to Mass

Our Churches in the Archdiocese of Newark, and our own Parish of St. Joseph's of the Palisades:

- Fully in accord with the directives of our governor of New Jersey, and our Archbishop Cardinal Tobin the following are the guidelines in order to attend Mass and ensure that our church building is safe for all.

Daily Mass:

With strict guidelines, and if fully prepared to do so, parishes of the Archdiocese, **may** open churches with the **required guidelines:**

1. **Not more than 150** people may attend Mass at any one time.
 2. All must wear **masks**;
 3. All must maintain **six feet of separation** from one another;
 4. **Communion distributed only in the hand.**
 5. **Those who may be vulnerable to the virus, those 60+ years old, recently or chronically ill, etc., encouraged to stay home and view Mass through social media.**
- **HERE AT ST. JOSEPH'S: Daily Mass for limited numbers of people:**
English Mass at 8:30 a.m. on Monday, Wednesday and Friday
Spanish Mass at 8:30 a.m. on Tuesday and Thursday, and Saturday at 9:00 a.m., Daily at 7:00 p.m.

Note: We suggest early arrival; when 150 people have arrived the doors must be closed.

Note also: Confessions at 6:00 p.m. daily.

• **SUNDAY MASS:**

With the same guidelines, but with STRICT CONTROL OF NUMBERS, Sunday Masses will be held **HERE AT ST. JOSEPH**

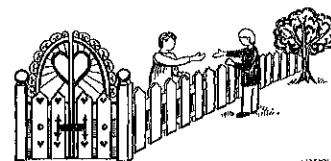

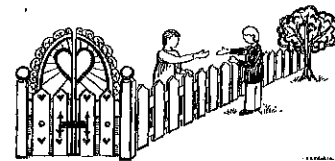

Reflexión Del Domingo

El tema de la corrección fraterna es un tema de mucha importancia, y de alguna manera se vuelve a reflejar en lo que leemos hoy en el evangelio de San Mateo. La semana pasada el Señor nos invitaba a corregir a nuestro prójimo con caridad, amor y mucha discreción; para evitar murmuraciones y eventos que puedan dañar la reputación del hermano que ha hecho algo equivocado.

Siguiendo en esta misma corriente, Este domingo leemos: *"se adelantó Pedro y preguntó a Jesús: «Señor, si mi hermano me ofende, ¿cuántas veces le tengo que perdonar? ¿Hasta siete veces?» Jesús le contesta: «No te digo hasta siete veces, sino hasta setenta veces siete.» Mt. 18: 21-22.* El perdonar a alguien que nos ha ofendido, o que ha hecho algo en contra nuestra, es algo que nos cuesta y que desafortunadamente solo queremos hacer hasta cuando hemos tomado revancha.

Esta clase de actitud desfigura totalmente lo que Jesús nos pide en su mensaje evangelizador: *"este mandamiento nuevo les doy: que se amen los unos a los otros. Así como yo los he amado". Juan 13:34* Las lecturas para este fin de semana son un claro llamado de atención de Dios a cada uno de nosotros, que creyéndonos mejores que los demás nos tómanos la libertad de juzgar y condenar a los que nos han ofendido. A los demás los condenados con mucha facilidad por sus malas acciones; pero cuando se trata de nosotros mismos; cuando hemos caído en malos juicios, o hemos hecho algo malo, tratamos de justificarnos de mil maneras, con tal de sentirnos bien, o de ser perdonados; mostrar a los demás algo que no somos.

Si queremos ser perdonados por nuestro Padre celestial, debemos de reconsiderar nuestra manera de actuar frente al pecado o las faltas de los otros, especialmente cuando ese pecado o esa falta me afecta a mí. Es difícil, pero el Señor nos llama al sacrificio, pero más que a eso; nos llama a amar y ser compasivos con los demás. Recordemos las palabras que oramos más de una vez al día en la oración del Padre Nuestro. "perdona nuestras ofensas así como nosotros perdonamos a los que nos ofenden".

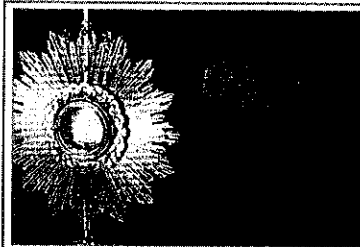
