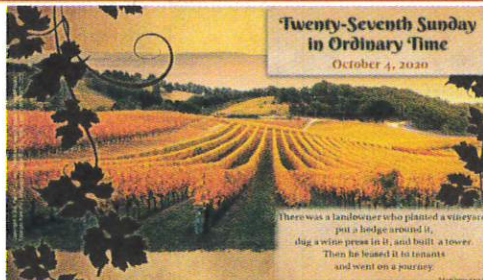

In Sunday's gospel, Jesus returns to the Old Testament symbol of the vineyard to teach about Israel, the Church, and the kingdom of God. God is the owner and the house of Israel is the vineyard. A cherished vine, Israel was plucked from Egypt and transplanted in a fertile land specially spaded and prepared by God, hedged about by the city walls of Jerusalem, watched over by the towering Temple. But the vineyard produced no good grapes for the wine, a symbol for the holy lives God wanted for His people. So God allowed His vineyard to be overrun by foreign invaders, as Isaiah foresees in the First Reading. Jesus picks up the story where Isaiah leaves off, even using Isaiah's words to describe the vineyard's wine press, hedge, and watchtower. Israel's religious leaders, instead of producing good fruits, they've killed the owner's servants, the prophets sent to gather the harvest of faithful souls. In a dark foreshadowing of His own crucifixion outside Jerusalem, Jesus says the tenants' final outrage will be to seize the owner's son, and to kill him outside the vineyard walls. For this, the vineyard, which Jesus calls the kingdom of God, will be taken away and given to new tenants—the leaders of the Church, who will produce its fruit. We need to take care that we don't let ourselves be overgrown with the thorns and briars of worldly anxiety. As today's Epistle advises, we need to fill our hearts and minds with noble intentions and virtuous deeds, rejoicing always that the Lord is near. *(Traducción en la pagina 7)*

THE ARCHDIOCESE OF MADRAS-MYLAPORE is situated in the South Indian State of Tamilnadu. The local church consists of approximately 4 hundred thousand Catholics who speak Tamil, English, Telugu, Malayalam and Hindi languages. Though ours is a metropolitan Archdiocese, good many parishes are rural and the people belong to the lower middle class and poor sections of the social ladder.

It is a sad state of affairs to note that there is a gradual increase in the mixed and disparity of cult marriages in this part of the world, thus resulting in the eventual rise of applicants for annulment, failure of marriages and estranged couples. So, we are experiencing breakdown of marriages and traditional family life at an alarming rate.

Last year we successfully completed building 'Holy Family Church' which happens to be the first church in our Archdiocese dedicated for the Holy Family and wish to establish a Family Renewal Center in the same campus to provide support and welfare to the families which, like in Europe and the United States have to face various challenges.

Matthew's Gospel today expands on Isaiah's ballad considerably. A comparison with the same story in Mark's Gospel clearly shows us that here the author is busy teaching this community of Jewish Christians: "This is a story about Israel a long time ago; this is also a story about Jesus and the skeptical leaders."

Jesus as much as told these Jewish leaders that they were the tenants who first stoned their own prophets. And he told the leaders they were the tenants who would soon even dispose of him—Jesus—and, in doing so, would forfeit their privileged place of presenting to the world the promised Messiah.

"And this," says Matthew's Gospel, "is a story about you, the inheritors of what was first offered to Israel." The reign of God was first opened to Israel and is now given to the whole world, but it must be received as a gift. The first Christians are the new tenants in the vineyard. The deeper reality of the reign or kingdom of God is that it is available to everyone on the face of the earth—Israel included.

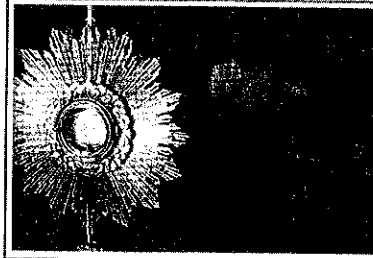


Food Pantry

SAINT FRANCIS OF ASSISI (1182-1226)-October 4

When Franco Zeffirelli's Brother Sun, Sister Moon was released (1972), people were shocked by the movie's graphic nudity in the dramatic conversion scene. Son of a wealthy merchant, Francis' aimless adolescence ended when a failed military expedition led to his imprisonment and complete breakdown. Once home, Francis rediscovered God in the beauty of nature and the ugliness of human suffering, caring for lepers, praying in the little church of San Damiano, whose crucified Jesus he heard calling, "Repair my house, Francis, which is falling into ruins." Francis sold his possessions—and his father's—to fulfill this command. When his father objected, Francis disobeyed: "I return the clothes, your name, and all you gave me: God alone is my Father now." Later, the pope would dream of a ragged friar stretching forth a single hand to prop up the crumbling papal Cathedral of Saint John Lateran. Francis indeed helped rebuild the universal Church, founding the Friars Minor (Franciscans), dying at a young forty-four, bearing the stigmata of the Christ whose living icon he remains—in the Church and far beyond it.

Keep in mind when coming to Mass

Our Churches in the Archdiocese of Newark, and our own Parish of St. Joseph's of the Palisades:

- Fully in accord with the directives of our governor of New Jersey, and our Archbishop Cardinal Tobin the following are the guidelines in order to attend Mass and ensure that our church building is safe for all.

Daily Mass:

With strict guidelines, and if fully prepared to do so, parishes of the Archdiocese, may open churches with the **required guidelines:**

1. **Not more than 150** people may attend Mass at any one time.
 2. All must wear **masks**;
 3. All must maintain **six feet of separation** from one another;
 4. **Communion distributed only in the hand.**
 5. Those who may be vulnerable to the virus, **those 60+ years old, recently or chronically ill, etc., encouraged to stay home** and view Mass through social media.
- **HERE AT ST. JOSEPH'S: Daily Mass for limited numbers of people:**
English Mass at 8:30 a.m. on Monday, Wednesday and Friday
Spanish Mass at 8:30 a.m. on Tuesday and Thursday, and Saturday at 9:00 a.m., Daily at 7:00 p.m.

Note: We suggest early arrival; when 150 people have arrived the doors must be closed.

Note also: Confessions at 6:00 p.m. daily.

• SUNDAY MASS:

With the same guidelines, but with STRICT CONTROL OF NUMBERS, Sunday Masses will be held **HERE AT ST. JOSEPH**

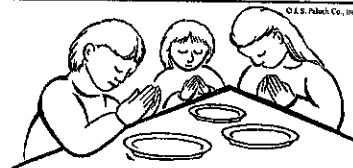

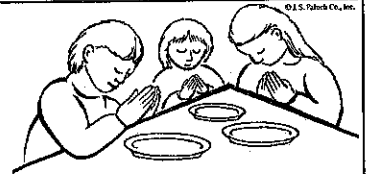

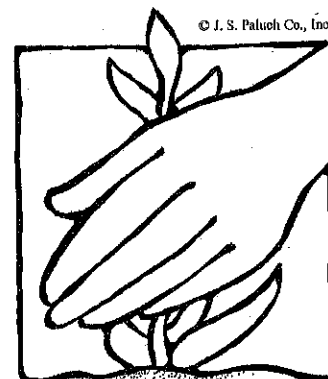

Reflexión del Domingo

En el evangelio del domingo, Jesús regresa al símbolo del Antiguo Testamento de la vidia para enseñar acerca de Israel, la Iglesia y el reino de Dios. Dios es el dueño y la casa de Israel es la vidia. Israel, una vidia muy apreciada, fue saqueada de Egipto y trasplantada en una tierra fértil especialmente salpicada y preparada por Dios, cubierta por las murallas de la ciudad de Jerusalén, vigilada por el Templo elevado. Pero la vidia no produjo buenas uvas para el vino, un símbolo para la vida Santa que Dios quería para su pueblo. Así que Dios permitió que Su vidia fuera invadida por Invasores extranjeros, como Isaias prevé en la Primera Lectura. Jesús retoma la historia donde Isaias se va, incluso usando las palabras de Isaias para describir la prensa de vino, el seto y la torre de vigilancia de la vidia. Los líderes religiosos de Israel, en lugar de producir buenos frutos, han matado a los siervos del propietario, los profetas enviados para recoger la cosecha de almas fieles. En un presagio oscuro de su propia crucifixión fuera de Jerusalén, Jesús dice que la Indignación final de los inquilinos será apoderarse del hijo del propietario y matarlo fuera de las paredes de los viñedos. Por eso, la vidia, que Jesús llama el reino de Dios, será llevada y dada a los nuevos inquilinos, los líderes de la Iglesia, que producirán su fruto. Tenemos que tener cuidado de no dejarnos crecer con las espinas y los brezos de la ansiedad mundana. Como aconseja la epístola de hoy, necesitamos llenar nuestros corazones y mentes con nobles intenciones y actos virtuosos, regocijándonos siempre de que el Señor está cerca.

Domingo de las Misiones

LA ARQUIDIÓCESIS DE MADRAS-MYLAPORE está situada en el estado indio sur de Tami Nadu. La Iglesia local está formada por aproximadamente 4,000 católicos que hablan tamil, inglés, telugu, malayalam e hindi. Aunque es una Arquidiócesis metropolitana, muchas parroquias son rurales y la gente pertenece a la clase media baja y a las secciones pobres de la escalera social.

Es una situación triste notar que hay un aumento gradual en la mezcla y disparidad de matrimonios de cultos en esta parte del mundo, lo que resulta en el aumento eventual de solicitantes de anulaciones, fracasos de matrimonios y parejas distanciadas. Por lo tanto, estamos experimentando la ruptura de los matrimonios y la vida familiar tradicional a un nivel alarmante.

El año pasado completamos con éxito la construcción de la Iglesia de la Sagrada Familia, que resulta ser la primera Iglesia de nuestra Arquidiócesis dedicada a la Sagrada Familia y desea establecer un Centro de renovación Familiar en el mismo campus para proporcionar apoyo y bienestar a las familias que, como en Europa y los Estados Unidos tienen que hacer frente a varios desafíos.

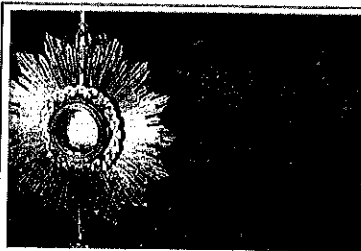
