## Welcome Rev. Helber Victoria, our new Pastor

This weekend, along with the Solemnity of Christ The King, our parish will have installed and given an official -but warm- welcome to our new Pastor, Father Helber Victoria, born in Tarqui-Huila, Colombia, on December 27, 1975, the sixth of eleven siblings. After 4 assignments, or more than 10 years serving as both parochial vicar and pastor, we as a community of faith will benefit from his experience and talents.

We have been living under the weight of a pandemic, much like the Israelites who wondered in the desert, a time of dry uncertainty and sudden changes. Few changes are easy, both they can opportunities to grow and breath new air, even if through a mask these days. In this solemnity, we call to mind that the spiritual and invisible kingdom, in which all the baptized participate, differs often from the worldly conception of power and control. Our King took human form, thus humbling himself; He changes neither the world nor the human heart by force or imposition, but rather participates in our humanity to transform us from within our human freedom. Precisely because of that human



condition, a priest "can deal patiently with the ignorant and the lost because he himself is subject to the human weakness." (Heb. 5:2). In welcoming our new pastor, we can imitate St. Therese of Liseaux in her prayer and support of all priests, who despite human imperfection, Christ uses as instruments of the grace, especially through the sacraments. The famous writer and apologist, C.S. Lewis, said that "the most dangerous sermon to the devil is the one received in a state of humility," and the same might be said of our neighbor, whether priest or not, and thus imitate Christ the King. The Parish of St. Joseph of the Palisades joyfully welcomes Fr. Helber Victoria. Our prayers and best wishes are with you as you shepherd and lead this great parish. May God bless you and guide you through your time here as Pastor.

## **Keep in mind when coming to Mass**

**Our Churches in the Archdiocese of Newark, and our own Parish of St. Joseph's of the Palisades:**

- Fully in accord with the directives of our governor of New Jersey, and our Archbishop Cardinal Tobin the following are the guidelines in order to attend Mass and ensure that our church building is safe for all.

### **Daily Mass:**

With strict guidelines, and if fully prepared to do so, parishes of the Archdiocese, **may** open churches with the **required guidelines:**

1. ***Not more than 150*** people may attend Mass at any one time.
  2. All must wear ***masks***;
  3. All must maintain ***six feet of separation*** from one another;
  4. ***Communion distributed only in the hand.***
  5. ***Those who may be vulnerable to the virus, those 60+ years old, recently or chronically ill, etc., encouraged to stay home and view Mass through social media.***
- **HERE AT ST. JOSEPH'S:** *Daily Mass for limited numbers of people:*  
English Mass at 8:30 a.m. on Monday, Wednesday and Friday  
Spanish Mass at 8:30 a.m. on Tuesday and Thursday, and Saturday at 9:00 a.m., Daily at 7:00 p.m.

**Note:** We suggest early arrival; when 150 people have arrived the doors must be closed.

**Note also:** Confessions at 6:00 p.m.—6:45 p.m. daily.

### • **SUNDAY MASS:**

With the same guidelines, but with STRICT CONTROL OF NUMBERS, Sunday Masses will be held **HERE AT ST. JOSEPH**

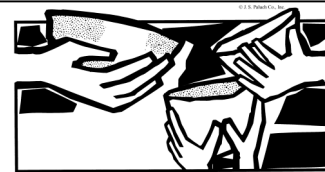

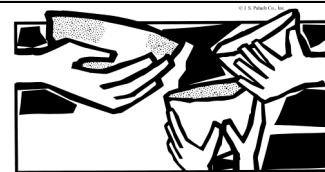

### Bienvenido Padre Helber Victoria

Este fin de semana, con la solemnidad de "Nuestro Señor Jesucristo, Rey del Universo," nuestra parroquia de San José habrá instalado a nuestro nuevo párroco, Padre Rev. Helber Victoria, nacido en Colombia el 27 de diciembre de 1975 en Tarqui-Huila, el sexto de once hermanos. Después de cuatro asignaturas, o más de diez años de experiencia como vicario parroquial y también como pastor, nuestra parroquia tiene la alegría de recibirlo de manera formal y oficial, aprovechando de su experiencia y talento.

Hemos estado viviendo la situación anómala de una pandemia, algo parecido al pueblo de Israel en el desierto, un tiempo de incertidumbre y cambios bruscos. Pocos son los cambios que son fáciles, pero pueden ser una oportunidad para crecer y respirar un aire nuevo, incluso si es por medio de un barbijo. En esta solemnidad, recordamos que el reino invisible y espiritual, en lo cual todos somos partícipes por el bautismo, es sin embargo muy distinto de la concepción mundana del poder y el control. Nuestro Rey se hizo humano y pequeño; ni el mundo ni el corazón humano lo cambió por la fuerza o buscando atajos, sino por el camino de la humildad, participando y aceptando la condición humana y débil de cada uno y transformándonos dentro de las condiciones de esta vida. Precisamente por su condición humana, un sacerdote "puede tratar con paciencia a los ignorantes y extraviados, ya que él mismo está sujeto a las debilidades humanas." (Heb. 5:2). En nuestra bienvenida, podemos imitar el ejemplo de Santa Teresita del niño Jesús, que hablaba de la importancia de rezar y ayudar a todos los sacerdotes, que a pesar de esa imperfección humana, la gracia de los sacramentos fluyen de Cristo a través de estos instrumentos suyos que frecuentemente padecen los ataques del maligno. El famoso escritor y apologista, C.S. Lewis, decía que "el sermón más peligroso para el demonio es el sermón que se recibe en un estado de ánimo de humildad," y lo mismo se podría decir de nuestro prójimo, sea un nuevo sacerdote o un desconocido, y así imitar a Cristo Rey.

La Parroquia de San José de Palisades le da la bienvenida con gran alegría al P. Helber Victoria. Nuestras oraciones y mejores deseos están con él en su misión de su pastoreo y liderazgo en esta gran comunidad de fe. Que Dios le bendiga y le guíe durante su tiempo como Pastor.
