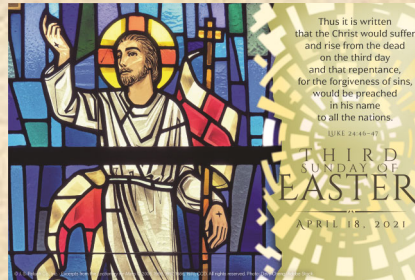

## Third Sunday of Easter

**Lk. 24, 35-48**

“On the third day He rose again” is the key clause in the Creed we recite on Sundays. It is also a favorite target of rationalists, those who deny the possibility of miracles or anything supernatural. One has to be naïve, these say, to give credence to any miracle recorded in Scripture; super-naïve to give credence to the resurrection. Dead men do not rise.

The charge of naivete is rarely made against Jesus himself. The wisdom of His teachings and the eloquence with which He expressed them shield Him from any such accusation. The fault, many rationalists say, was with His disciples, who spread the fable that Jesus had risen. They were probably not deliberate liars, just naïve enough to be fooled by their own daydreams, a textbook case of what psychologists call wish fulfillment. So strongly did they wish Jesus alive that they imagined He was and gave reality to the figment of their own imagination.

How well does the case against the disciples stand up? This passage from Luke, describing the events in Jerusalem on the Sunday after the burial of Jesus, is a good place to test it.

The disciples were in the room where Jesus had shared his final meal with them. Suddenly, they saw Him in the midst, bidding them peace. What was the disciples initial response? They were surprised. They were so sure this apparition was not the real Jesus that they called it a ghost. But Jesus gave them evidence that He was not a ghost or a figment of their imagination. He was flesh and blood, and He had them touch His hands and feet...after feeling how solid these were, they became “incredulous for joy.” That is, although exultant, they still held back belief.

Finally, as irrefutable proof He was no phantom but a living human being like themselves, Jesus sat down and ate some fish in their presence. The disciples, then, were not naïve. And a good thing, too, for the sake of people like us who listen to the Gospel they proclaimed.

The miracles played a big part in the life of Jesus. His purpose was to win mankind from sin and lead us back to God. That is why He died, why He rose from the dead. His return from death to life made possible our return from the death of sin to the life of God’s children. For us that is His greatest miracle and most amazing Easter message. *(Traducción en la página 7)*

**FEAST OF FAITH**

**The Second Reading**

The Liturgy of the Word generally follows a consistent pattern of three readings and a psalm. The second reading is always taken from one of the New Testament epistles or the book of Revelation, and generally is not intentionally aligned with either the Gospel or the first reading.

Where would we be without these letters in which great saints and apostles like Paul, Peter, James, and John share their wisdom and pastoral good sense with the early Christian communities? It is in these letters, even more than in the Gospel narratives, that we learn what it means to be church: to live with each other, in the world yet not of the world, in these days after the Lord's resurrection. Each New Testament letter was written by a particular leader for a particular community at a particular time. We are reminded of this at the beginning of the proclamation—"A reading from the letter of Saint Paul to the Ephesians," or the Corinthians, or the Thessalonians. These texts were shaped by their particular historical and cultural context, but at the same time, through the liturgy, these letters are written to us, here, today. They speak to the realities of Christian living no matter where—or when—we live. They are truly "the word of the Lord" for us.

## **Keep in mind when coming to Mass**

**Our Churches in the Archdiocese of Newark, and our own Parish of St. Joseph's of the Palisades:**

- Fully in accord with the directives of our governor of New Jersey, and our Archbishop Cardinal Tobin the following are the guidelines in order to attend Mass and ensure that our church building is safe for all.

### **Daily Mass:**

With strict guidelines, and if fully prepared to do so, parishes of the Archdiocese, **may** open churches with the **required guidelines:**

1. ***Not more than 150*** people may attend Mass at any one time.
  2. All must wear ***masks***;
  3. All must maintain ***six feet of separation*** from one another;
  4. ***Communion distributed only in the hand.***
  5. Those who may be vulnerable to the virus, ***those 60+ years old, recently or chronically ill, etc., encouraged to stay home*** and view Mass through social media.
- **HERE AT ST. JOSEPH'S:** ***Daily Mass for limited numbers of people:***  
English Mass at 8:30 a.m. on Monday, Wednesday and Friday  
Spanish Mass at 8:30 a.m. on Tuesday and Thursday, and Saturday at 9:00 a.m., Daily at 7:00 p.m.

**Note:** We suggest early arrival; when **150 people have arrived the doors must be closed.**

**Note also:** Confessions at 6:00 p.m.—6:45 p.m. daily.

### • **SUNDAY MASS:**

With the same guidelines, but with STRICT CONTROL OF NUMBERS, Sunday Masses will be held **HERE AT ST. JOSEPH**

### Tercer Domingo de Pascua

**Lucas 24, 35-48**

"Al tercer día resucitó" es la cláusula clave en el Credo que recitamos los domingos. También es un blanco favorito de los racionalistas, aquellos que niegan la posibilidad de milagros o cualquier cosa sobrenatural. Uno tiene que ser ingenuo, dicen estos, para dar crédito a cualquier milagro registrado en las Escrituras; súper ingenuo para dar crédito a la resurrección. Los hombres muertos no resucitan.

La acusación de ingenuidad rara vez se hace contra Jesús mismo. La sabiduría de Sus enseñanzas y la elocuencia con la que Él las expresó lo protegen de cualquier acusación de ese tipo. La culpa, dicen muchos racionalistas, fue con Sus discípulos, que difundieron la fábula que Jesús había resucitado. Probablemente no eran mentirosos deliberados, tan solo lo suficientemente ingenuos como para ser engañados por sus propios sueños, un caso de libro de texto de lo que los psicólogos llaman cumplimiento de deseos. Tan fuertemente desearon a Jesús vivo que imaginaron que él era y dieron realidad a la figura de su propia imaginación.

¿Qué tan bien se levanta el caso contra los discípulos? Este pasaje de Lucas, que describe los acontecimientos en Jerusalén el domingo después del entierro de Jesús, es un buen lugar para probarlo.

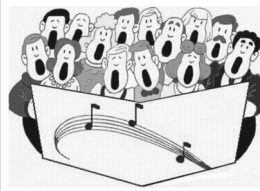
Los discípulos estaban en la habitación donde Jesús había compartido su última comida con ellos. De repente, lo vieron en medio, deseándoles paz. ¿Cuál fue la respuesta inicial de los discípulos? Se sorprendieron. Estaban tan seguros de que esta aparición no era el verdadero Jesús que lo llamaron un fantasma. Pero Jesús les dio evidencia que Él no era un fantasma o figura de su imaginación porque el tenía cuerpo y sangre y les mostro las manos y sus pies. Después de comprobar la solidez de las pruebas los discípulos se llenaron de tanta alegría, que aunque exultantes les costaba creer. Finalmente, como prueba irrefutable que no era un fantasma sino un ser humano vivo como ellos, Jesús se sentó y comió algunos peces en su presencia. Los discípulos, entonces, no eran ingenuos. Y algo bueno, también, por el bien de personas como nosotros que escuchan el Evangelio que ellos proclamaron.

Los milagros desempeñaron un papel importante en la vida de Jesús. Su propósito era ganar a la humanidad del pecado y llevarla de vuelta a Dios. Es por eso que murió y por qué resucitó de entre los muertos. Su regreso de la muerte a la vida hizo posible el regreso de la muerte del pecador a la vida de los hijos de Dios. Para nosotros ese es su mayor milagro y el más asombroso mensaje de Pascua.

### Oración a San Miguel Arcángel
