OF THE LORD
MAY 16, 2021

Men of Galilee,
why are you standing there
looking up at the sky?
This Jesus who has been
taken up from you
into heaven will return
in the same way.

ACTS 1:11

"Go out to the whole world and proclaim the Good News to all creation."

(Mark 16, 15-16)

The Gospel of this Sunday is of paramount importance in our lives. These words are Christ's last legacy before returning to the Kingdom of Heaven. Jesus says goodbye by entrusting His disciples to continue their task, the task of saving the world. Sometimes we forget that we have a responsibility with our brothers. This command of Jesus has to motivate us to be missionaries. I especially like to read this

passage of the Gospel when I celebrate a baptism, and it is that each of us, on the day of our baptism, were given the necessary weapons to carry out our mission. On the day of my baptism, just as it happened on that of each one of you, the celebrant said: "that you may join your people and be forever members of Christ, Priest, Prophet and King." If we are with Christ priests, prophets and kings, we have a great responsibility: to sanctify, proclaim and denounce, and to make present the Kingdom of God in this world.

Disciples are given the means necessary for salvation: belief in Jesus and baptism within the Christian community. They are commissioned to "proclaim the gospel to the whole world" so that everyone has the opportunity to be saved.

Sometimes we can be discouraged when we proclaim the message and it seems to us that those who listen to us are deaf to the voice of God. In order to be good missionaries, we need to understand that our task is to proclaim, not to judge. It is not for us to decide whether it is worth preaching to someone the Word of God or not. We just have to announce, we may not see the fruit of our effort, but the Word of God that we sow will bear its fruit at the right time, and if in the end someone chooses not to believe, we will have fulfilled our responsibility to proclaim.

Many may hear the message and not all of them will open their hearts to Christ, that is not as sad as that of many who cannot open their hearts to Christ because they never hear the message, because there is no Catholic Christian to speak to them and announce the Good News to them.

Don't be afraid to be a missionary. In this task you are not alone. The Holy Spirit anoints you, consecrates you, gives you strength and courage, but we will be speaking of the Holy Spirit next week.

Keep in mind when coming to Mass

Our Churches in the Archdiocese of Newark, and our own Parish of St. Joseph's of the Palisades:

- Fully in accord with the directives of our governor of New Jersey, and our Archbishop Cardinal Tobin the following are the guidelines in order to attend Mass and ensure that our church building is safe for all.

Daily Mass:

With strict guidelines, and if fully prepared to do so, parishes of the Archdiocese, **may** open churches with the **required guidelines:**

1. ***Not more than 150*** people may attend Mass at any one time.
 2. All must wear ***masks***;
 3. All must maintain ***six feet of separation*** from one another;
 4. ***Communion distributed only in the hand.***
 5. Those who may be vulnerable to the virus, ***those 60+ years old, recently or chronically ill, etc., encouraged to stay home*** and view Mass through social media.
- **HERE AT ST. JOSEPH'S:** *Daily Mass for limited numbers of people:*
English Mass at 8:30 a.m. on Monday, Wednesday and Friday
Spanish Mass at 8:30 a.m. on Tuesday and Thursday, and Saturday at 9:00 a.m., Daily at 7:00 p.m.

Note: We suggest early arrival; when **150 people have arrived the doors must be closed.**

Note also: Confessions at 6:00 p.m.—6:45 p.m. daily.

• **SUNDAY MASS:**

With the same guidelines, but with STRICT CONTROL OF NUMBERS, Sunday Masses will be held **HERE AT ST. JOSEPH**

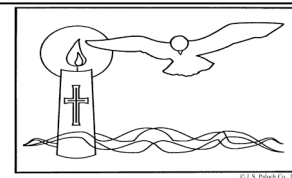

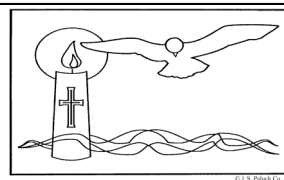

“Id por todo el mundo y proclamad la Buena Nueva a toda la creación. El que crea y sea bautizado, se salvará; el que no crea, se condenará.” (Marcos 16, 15-16)

Paz y bien hermana y hermano.

El Evangelio de este domingo tiene una importancia primordial en nuestras vidas. Estas palabras son el último legado de Cristo antes de regresar al Reino de los Cielos. Jesús se despide encomendando a sus discípulos continuar su tarea, la tarea de salvar al mundo. A veces se nos olvida que tenemos una responsabilidad con nuestros hermanos, esta encomienda de Jesús tiene que motivarnos a ser misioneros.

Especialmente me gusta leer este fragmento del Evangelio cuando celebro un bautizo, y es que a cada uno de nosotros, el día de nuestro bautismo, se nos dieron las armas necesarias para llevar adelante nuestra misión. El día de mi bautizo, así como sucedió en el de cada uno de ustedes, el celebrante dijo: “para que se incorporen a su pueblo y sean para siempre miembros de Cristo, Sacerdote, Profeta y Rey”. Si somos con Cristo sacerdotes, profetas y reyes, tenemos una responsabilidad grande, la de santificar, anunciar y denunciar, y la de hacer presente el Reino de Dios en este mundo.

A los discípulos se les dan los medios necesarios para la salvación: la creencia en Jesús y el bautismo dentro de la comunidad cristiana. Se les comisiona “proclamar el Evangelio al mundo entero” para que todos tengan la oportunidad de ser salvos.

A veces podemos desalentarnos cuando anunciamos el mensaje y nos parece que los que nos escuchan están sordos a la voz de Dios. Para poder ser buenos misioneros tenemos que entender que nuestra tarea es anunciar, no juzgar. No nos toca a nosotros decidir si vale la pena predicarle a alguien la Palabra de Dios o no. Solo tenemos que anunciar, quizás no veamos el fruto de nuestro esfuerzo, pero la Palabra de Dios que nosotros sembramos dará su fruto en el momento indicado, y si al final alguien opta por no creer, nosotros habremos cumplido con nuestra responsabilidad de anunciar.

Puede que muchos oigan el mensaje y no todos abran sus corazones a Cristo, eso no es tan triste como que muchos no puedan abrir sus corazones a Cristo porque nunca escuchen el mensaje, porque no haya un cristiano católico que le hable y le anuncie la Buena Nueva.

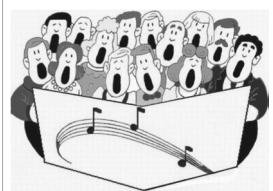

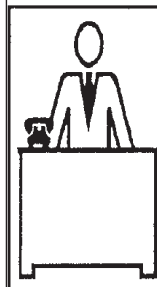
