Christi. These feasts should be intimate reminders of how deeply God loves us, how He chose us, from before the foundation of the world, to be His children (see Ephesians 1:4–5). Today's readings illuminate how all God's words and works were meant to prepare for the revelation of the Trinity and God's blessing in Jesus Christ; the blessing we inherited in Baptism, and renew in each Eucharist. By God's word the heavens and earth were filled with His kindness, we sing in today's Psalm. Out of love, God called Abraham and chose his descendants to be His own people, Moses says in today's First Reading (see Deuteronomy 4:20,37). Through the Israelites, He revealed to the nations that He alone is Lord and there is no other. In Jesus, God's word took flesh as a son of Abraham (see Matthew 1:1). And Jesus reveals in the Gospel today that the one God is Father, Son, and Spirit, and that He desires to make all people His own. As He led Israel out of Egypt, God freed us from slavery, Paul says in today's Epistle. As He adopted Israel (see Romans 9:4), He gives us the Spirit by which we can know Him as "Our Father." The Eucharist is His pledge; that He will be with us until the end, that He will deliver us from death to live forever in the promised land of His kingdom.



Updated Directives During the Covid-19 Pandemic

Given the reinstatement by the Bishops of NJ of the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and the lessening of restrictions from the state, the following is provided as an immediate update.

Effective May 28, masks will no longer be required for fully vaccinated persons. If not fully vaccinated, persons are strongly encouraged to follow CDC guidance and wear a face mask in public settings. Masks are still required on public transit and in health care settings, prisons, child-care facilities and schools, among other places. People will no longer be required to socially distance indoors or outdoors, (May 28), although unvaccinated persons should continue to maintain a safe distance from others. Those vaccinated can certainly continue using their masks if they will feel more comfortable.

Effective June 4, all indoor gathering limits will be removed.

Although these directives represent a reduction of pandemic restrictions, the local pastors/administrators/chaplains can impose stricter regulations as needed. These may include wearing masks and social distancing.

These directives apply to all indoor and outdoor events.

Mass Attendance

Cardinal Tobin and the Bishops of New Jersey are reinstating the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation effective June 5/6, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. To read the official statement, please visit: <https://www.rcan.org/>

Updated Directives

- Churches and parish facilities may return to 100 per cent capacity with no social distancing for both indoor and outdoor services and activities, as of June 4, 2021.
- Parishioners should be informed that if they are vaccinated, they are no longer required to wear a mask. It is not required for parishioners to show proof of vaccination.
- Anyone not fully vaccinated should wear a mask. Any vaccinated person preferring to wear a mask should feel free to do so.

The Communion Rite

- The Sign of Peace should be offered but continue to be made without physical contact.
- Communicants will continue to receive Communion in the hand. If not fully vaccinated, they lower their masks to consume the host, then replace their masks. The chalice is still prohibited for the assembly.

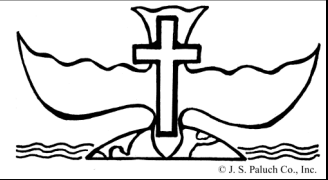
Livestreaming Mass

Livestreaming may continue for those who are ill; those who have reason to believe that they were recently exposed to the coronavirus or another serious or contagious illness; those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility and those with serious underlying health conditions.

It still needs to be noted that even with precautions in place, it is still possible to contract Covid-19 in church.

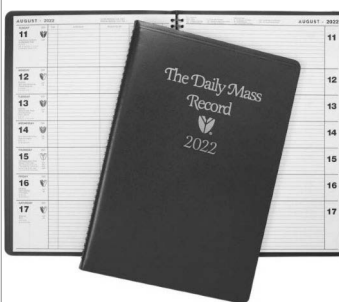
Oración a San Miguel Arcángel

Reflexión del Domingo

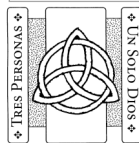
El domingo pasado celebramos el envío del Espíritu, que selló el nuevo pacto de Dios y hizo una nueva creación. En esta nueva creación, vivimos en la familia de Dios, que se ha revelado como Trinidad de amor. Compartimos Su naturaleza divina a través de Su Cuerpo y Su Sangre (2 Pedro 1:4). Este es el significado de las tres fiestas que culminan la temporada de Pascua: Pentecostés, Domingo de la Trinidad y Corpus Christi. Estas fiestas deben ser recordatorios íntimos de cuán profundamente Dios nos ama, cómo nos eligió, desde antes de la fundación del mundo, para ser sus hijos (Efesios 1: 4-5). Las lecturas de hoy ilustran cómo todas las palabras y obras de Dios estaban destinadas a prepararnos para la revelación de la Trinidad y la bendición de Dios en Jesucristo, la bendición que heredamos en el Bautismo y renovamos en cada Eucaristía. Por la palabra de Dios, los cielos y la tierra se llenaron de Su bondad, cantamos en el Salmo de hoy. Por amor, Dios llamó a Abraham y eligió a sus descendientes para que fueran su propio pueblo, dice Moisés en la primera lectura de hoy (Deuteronomio 4: 20,37). A través de los israelitas, reveló a las naciones que solo Él es el Señor y no hay otro. En Jesús, la palabra de Dios se hizo carne como un hijo de Abraham (ver Mateo 1:1). Y Jesús revela en el Evangelio de hoy que el único Dios es Padre, Hijo y Espíritu, y que desea hacer suyos a todas las personas. Al sacar a Israel de Egipto, Dios nos liberó de la esclavitud, dice Pablo en la epístola de hoy. Al adoptar a Israel (Romanos 9: 4), nos da el Espíritu por el cual podemos conocerlo como "Padre nuestro." La Eucaristía es Su promesa: que Él estará con nosotros hasta el final, que Él nos libraré de la muerte para vivir para siempre en la tierra prometida de Su reino.

Directivas actualizadas durante la Pandemia Covid-19

Dado el restablecimiento por parte de los obispos de Nueva Jersey de la obligación de asistir a la Misa dominical y la disminución de las restricciones del estado, se proporciona lo siguiente como una actualización inmediata.

A partir del 28 de mayo, ya no se requerirán máscaras para las personas totalmente vacunadas. Si no están totalmente vacunadas, se recomienda a las personas que sigan las directrices del CDC y lleven una máscara facial en lugares públicos. Todavía se requieren máscaras en el transporte público y en entornos de atención médica, prisiones, centros de cuidado infantil y escuelas, entre otros lugares. Las personas ya no tendrán que distanciarse socialmente en el interior o al aire libre (mayo de 28), aunque las personas no vacunadas deben seguir manteniendo una distancia segura de las demás. Las personas vacunadas ciertamente pueden seguir usando sus máscaras si se sienten más cómodas.

A partir del 4 de junio, se eliminarán todos los límites de congregarse en los interiores.

Aunque estas directivas representan una reducción de las restricciones pandémicas, los pastores/administradores/capellanes locales pueden imponer regulaciones más estrictas según sea necesario. Estos pueden incluir usar máscaras y el distanciamiento social.

Las directivas se aplican a todos los eventos en interiores y exteriores.

Directivas actualizadas

- Las iglesias e instalaciones parroquiales pueden volver al 100% de capacidad sin distanciamiento social para los servicios y actividades tanto interiores como al aire libre, el 4 de junio de 2021.
- Los feligreses deben ser informados de que si son vacunados, ya no deben usar una máscara. No es necesario que los feligreses muestren pruebas de vacunación. **Cualquier persona que no esté completamente vacunada debe usar una máscara.** Personas vacunadas que prefieren usar una máscara deben sentirse libre de hacerlo.

El Rito de Comunión

- La Señal de la Paz debe ser ofrecida, pero debe ser hecho sin contacto físico.
- Los comunicantes seguirán recibiendo la Comunión en la mano. Si no están completamente vacunados, bajen sus máscaras para consumir el Cuerpo de Cristo, y luego reemplacen sus máscaras. El cáliz sigue siendo prohibido para la asamblea.

La Transmisión de la Misa en Vivo

La transmisión de la Misa en vivo puede continuar para aquellos que están enfermos; aquellos que tienen razones para creer que estuvieron expuestos recientemente al coronavirus u otra enfermedad grave o contagiosa; aquellos que están confinados a su hogar, un hospital o centro de enfermería y aquellos con condiciones graves de salud.

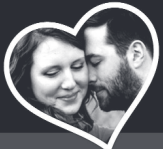
