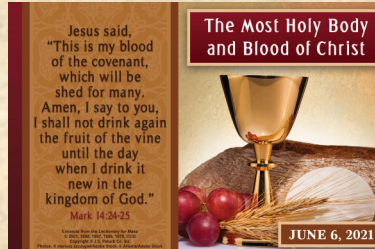

## Corpus Christi

The Catholic Church celebrates today with imminence the feast of the Eucharist whose center is Jesus, because it is He, who is given to us as food.

The Christian family gathers, re-discovers and finds comforts again around the Eucharist to fortify their spiritual life. We gather around the altar which is the center of our Christian gathering.

The Mass is comprised of an entrance rite with a song, glory according to liturgical time, prayer, collection, Old Testament readings, Gospel, homily and the consecration which is the center and the most important part in which Jesus consecrated bread and wine into his body and blood which is what the priest transforms in the Eucharist.

The oldest text of the consecration is in 1a. Corinthians 11:23-25 written in 57 AD and the Gospel text of Mark 14:12-16; 22-26 of this feast written in the year 70; Matthew's and Luke's were later written. The four evangelists agreed on the same narrative with some differences, but the essential and historical thing is what Jesus performed at the Last Supper with His apostles the night before His death at the feast of the loaves that coincides with the Jewish Passover. The scholars of the subject also coincided that it was on a Thursday in the month April in the year 30 around 5:30 p.m., the time when the Jewish Passover began in all of Jerusalem. The Jewish people celebrated for more than 1200 years the liberation from bondage from Egypt and Jesus took the occasion to carry out the deliverance from sin by shedding his blood on the cross.

On this Feast of Corpus Christi, Catholic Christians celebrate the revival of the mystery of salvation, which as Saint Paul says, every time we eat this bread and drink of this blood, we proclaim the death of Jesus until He returns (1a. Cor. 11:26). By proclaiming His death we celebrate our deliverance from sin until He becomes glorious to judge the living and the dead. The Feast of Corpus Christi celebrated at Mass is the presence of Jesus every time we celebrate Mass until He returns.

### SACRIFICE

Today the Church focuses on the Eucharist. Today's readings remind us how connected to ancient blood sacrifices we are when offering our unbloody sacrifice. The reading from Exodus describes a solemn ritual designed so the Israelites would never forget their covenant with God.

The reading from the Letter to the Hebrews turns us from those ancient animal sacrifices, the first efforts to worship the living God. Our sacrifice is the body and blood of the Son of God. Because of Christ we have a new covenant.

The Gospel from Mark retells the establishment of that covenant, the familiar story of the Last Supper. Juxtaposed with the story of animal sacrifice as it is here, we are challenged to listen with new attention, to remember the great price paid for our salvation. Jesus gave his body and every drop of his blood for us.

## **ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK**

### **Updated Directives During the Covid-19 Pandemic**

Given the reinstatement by the Bishops of NJ of the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and the lessening of restrictions from the state, the following is provided as an immediate update.

**Effective May 28**, masks will no longer be required for fully vaccinated persons. If not fully vaccinated, persons are strongly encouraged to follow CDC guidance and wear a face mask in public settings. Masks are still required on public transit and in health care settings, prisons, child-care facilities and schools, among other places. People will no longer be required to socially distance indoors or outdoors, (May 28), although unvaccinated persons should continue to maintain a safe distance from others. Those vaccinated can certainly continue using their masks if they will feel more comfortable.

**Effective June 4**, all indoor gathering limits will be removed.

Although these directives represent a reduction of pandemic restrictions, the local pastors/administrators/chaplains can impose stricter regulations as needed. These may include wearing masks and social distancing.

These directives apply to all indoor and outdoor events.

#### **Mass Attendance**

Cardinal Tobin and the Bishops of New Jersey are reinstating the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation effective June 5/6, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. To read the official statement, please visit: <https://www.rcan.org/>

#### **Updated Directives**

- Churches and parish facilities may return to 100 per cent capacity with no social distancing for both indoor and outdoor services and activities, as of June 4, 2021.
- Parishioners should be informed that if they are vaccinated, they are no longer required to wear a mask. It is not required for parishioners to show proof of vaccination.
- Anyone not fully vaccinated should wear a mask. Any vaccinated person preferring to wear a mask should feel free to do so.

#### **The Communion Rite**

- The Sign of Peace should be offered but continue to be made without physical contact.
- Communicants will continue to receive Communion in the hand. If not fully vaccinated, they lower their masks to consume the host, then replace their masks. The chalice is still prohibited for the assembly.

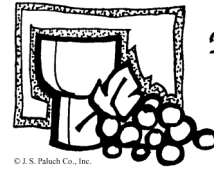
#### **Livestreaming Mass**

Livestreaming may continue for those who are ill; those who have reason to believe that they were recently exposed to the coronavirus or another serious or contagious illness; those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility and those with serious underlying health conditions.

It still needs to be noted that even with precautions in place, it is still possible to contract Covid-19 in church.

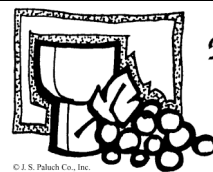

La Iglesia Católica celebra hoy con inminencia la fiesta de la Eucaristía cuyo centro es Jesús, pues es El, quien se nos da como alimento.

En torno a la Eucaristía la familia cristiana se reúne, se re-encuentra y se reconforta para tonificar su vida espiritual. Nos reunimos en torno al altar que es el centro de nuestra reunión cristiana.

La Misa esta compuesta por un rito de entrada con un canto, gloria según el tiempo litúrgico, oración, colecta, lecturas del Antigua Testamento, evangelio, homilía y la consagración que es el centro y la parte más importante en que Jesús consagró el pan y el vino en su cuerpo y sangre que es lo que re-activa el sacerdote en la Eucaristía.

El texto más antigua de la consagración esta en 1a. Corintios 11:23-25 escrito en año 57 después de Cristo y el texto del Evangelio de Marcos 14:12-16; 22-26 de esta fiesta escrito en el año 70; Mateo y Lucas fueron escritos más tarde. ## Arquidiócesis de Newark

### Directivas actualizadas durante la Pandemia Covid-19

Dado el restablecimiento por parte de los obispos de Nueva Jersey de la obligación de asistir a la Misa dominical y la disminución de las restricciones del estado, se proporciona lo siguiente como una actualización inmediata.

**A partir del 28 de mayo**, ya no se requerirán máscaras para las personas totalmente vacunadas. Si no están totalmente vacunadas, se recomienda a las personas que sigan las directrices del CDC y lleven una máscara facial en lugares públicos. Todavía se requieren máscaras en el transporte público y en entornos de atención médica, prisiones, centros de cuidado infantil y escuelas, entre otros lugares. Las personas ya no tendrán que distanciarse socialmente en el interior o al aire libre (mayo de 28), aunque las personas no vacunadas deben seguir manteniendo una distancia segura de las demás. Las personas vacunadas ciertamente pueden seguir usando sus máscaras si se sienten más cómodas.

**A partir del 4 de junio**, se eliminarán todos los límites de congregarse en los interiores.

Aunque estas directivas representan una reducción de las restricciones pandémicas, los pastores/administradores/capellanes locales pueden imponer regulaciones más estrictas según sea necesario. Estos pueden incluir usar máscaras y el distanciamiento social.

Las directivas se aplican a todos los eventos en interiores y exteriores.

### Directivas actualizadas

- Las iglesias e instalaciones parroquiales pueden volver al 100% de capacidad sin distanciamiento social para los servicios y actividades tanto interiores como al aire libre, el 4 de junio de 2021.
- Los feligreses deben ser informados de que si son vacunados, ya no deben usar una máscara. No es necesario que los feligreses muestren pruebas de vacunación. **Cualquier persona que no esté completamente vacunada debe usar una máscara.** Personas vacunadas que prefieren usar una máscara deben sentirse libre de hacerlo.

### El Rito de Comunión

- La Señal de la Paz debe ser ofrecida, pero debe ser hecho sin contacto físico.
- Los comunicantes seguirán recibiendo la Comunión en la mano. Si no están completamente vacunados, bajen sus máscaras para consumir el Cuerpo de Cristo, y luego reemplacen sus máscaras. El cáliz sigue siendo prohibido para la asamblea.
