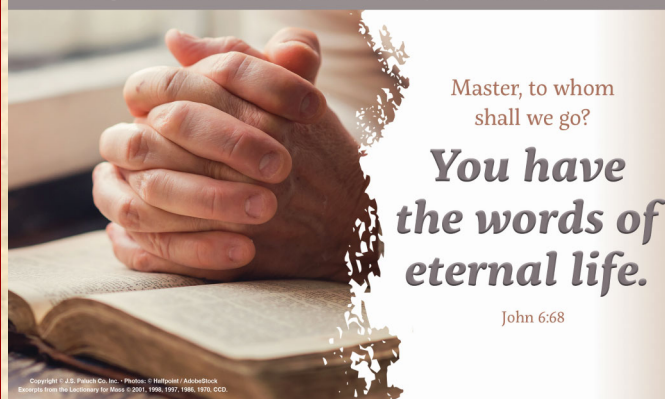

August 22, 2021 • Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time



Master, to whom shall we go?

You have the words of eternal life.

John 6:68

John 6:60-69

In the readings of this twenty-first Sunday of Ordinary Time we are told about the Covenant, the Church, the actual presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, and the personal commitment that Jesus requires from his followers.

In the first reading Joshua asks God's people to make their choice between the God of their fathers or the pagan deities of the Amorites, but the people decided to follow the true God, that is, that of their parents.

In the second reading St. Paul to the Ephesians speaks about the ideal relationship that should exist between the members of the nascent Church suggesting the respect that should exist between spouses in the example of Christ's faithfulness to his Church; just as Christ loves his Church, so should spouses love each other and renew their marriage commitments. In the same way the Church has to renew its baptismal commitments to Jesus, and this is what we do at each Mass where we join Jesus and each of its members (Mystical Body of Christ), thus celebrating unity with a Jesus who lives Risen in the midst of our community.

At the conclusion of this Gospel Jesus asks the disciples if they too want to abandon him as others who murmured to Jesus had done, saying to the Jews, "My flesh is true food and my blood is true drink." Peter said to Jesus. "Lord to whom shall we go? You alone have words of eternal life; and we believe and know that you are the Holy One of God."

May each of us baptized be faithful to Jesus and his Church in fulfilling our commitments to Him, and to our most neediest brothers and sisters.

FEAST OF FAITH Come, Spirit!

The presider at the Eucharist can choose from among a number of different Eucharistic Prayers, all of which follow a similar pattern. Almost always, they begin with an *epiclesis*, a Greek word that means "invocation upon" or "calling over here." At this moment in the prayer, the priest calls down the Holy Spirit upon the gifts of bread and wine that we have brought to the altar: "Father, we bring you these gifts. We ask you to make them holy by the power of your Spirit, that they may become the body and blood of your Son" (Eucharistic Prayer III). The words of the prayer are accompanied by the ritual gesture of the laying on of hands, the ancient sign of the gift of the Spirit, which is also used in most sacramental celebrations, from the rite of confirmation to the ordination of deacons, priests, and bishops. Liturgists sometimes call this first *epiclesis* the *epiclesis* of consecration. Later in the Eucharistic Prayer, there will be another *epiclesis*, the *epiclesis* of communion, as the priest asks that the Holy Spirit be sent upon us to transform us. "Grant that we, who are nourished by his body and blood, may be filled with his Holy Spirit, and become one body, one spirit in Christ" (Eucharistic Prayer III).

There is an axiom that states, "Not to decide is to decide." This saying was popular in the turbulent times of the Vietnam War. As he pursued the mission to which the Father called him, he continually decided for us and for the Father. He worked hard to lay out a scenario that would enable others to make similar choices. Never did he make decisions for others or force others into decisions, even decisions that had eternal ramifications. Jesus is inviting us to make such decisions today. We won't be absolutely sure. What is sure, however, is the command that issues from God's word: Take the risk. Decide!

We are all called to be holy men and holy women, "saints next door." *Be you therefore perfect, as also your heavenly Father is perfect" (Matthew 5:48)*

In his Apostolic Exhortation GAUDETE ET EXULTATE, ON THE CALL TO HOLINESS IN TODAY'S WORLD, Pope Francis calls our attention to what the Second Vatican Council termed "the universal call to holiness." We Catholics believe that every human being is made in the image and likeness of God, and all of us—no matter who we are or what our personal history may be—are called to be holy.

What does it mean to be holy? According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, "the desire for God is written in the human heart" (#27). We human beings are meant to search for God, to find him and to become united with him—both here on Earth and in our heavenly home.

Holiness is the quality of our union with God, the indication of our closeness to him. Holy women and men are close to God.

That's why we call them "saints," which comes from the Latin word sanctus or holy.

In his encyclical "Spe Salvi" ("Saved by Hope"), Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI writes: "Life is a voyage on the sea of history, often dark and stormy, a voyage in which we watch for the stars that indicate the route. The true stars of our life are the people who have lived good lives." They are the lights of hope, the Holy Father writes, because they point us to Jesus Christ, "the true light, the sun that has risen above all the shadows of history" (#49).

Saints shine with the light of Christ. Many of the saints have been officially recognized by the Church through a process that results in the solemn proclamation (canonization) that they practiced heroic virtue and lived in fidelity to God's grace. But during the last 2,000 years, many other holy women and men have given themselves wholeheartedly to Jesus Christ without being declared saints by the Church. These are the men and women that Pope Francis calls "the middle class of holiness" or "saints next door." These are the saints we celebrate on Nov. 1, the Solemnity of All Saints.

All of us are called to holiness, to closeness to God, but unfortunately, most of us find ourselves further away from God than we would like to be. That's why Christ gives us the sacraments—especially the Eucharist and the sacrament of penance—to help us in our daily struggles on the way to holiness. We are all called to be close to God, but for many of us (most of us?), the journey is a long and difficult one.

Thanks be to God; his grace and mercy are endless. Our loving and merciful God never gives up on us. Even after we die, we Christians believe that it is still possible to atone for our sins, to grow in holiness and come closer to God. That's why we pray for those who have died. It's also why the Church celebrates the feast of All Souls on Nov. 2. We are all called to become holy—both the living and the dead—and the grace of our Lord Jesus is not confined to this world, but can reach even into the state of being we call purgatory, to touch the hearts of those "poor souls" who must undergo a process of purification before being fully united with God.

Saints are men and women who know how to pray, to be close to God and communicate with him from the heart. They are people who in times of difficulty, as well as in good times, raise their minds and hearts to the Lord. The saints seek God's will in their lives. They share with him their hopes and frustrations, their loneliness, anger and fear. Through their prayer, their attentive listening even more than the words they speak, the holy men and women we call saints are in constant contact with God.

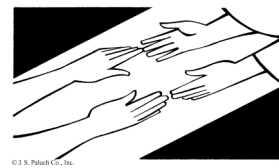
As we recall the holy people—living and deceased—who serve as stars guiding us to Christ, let's pray for the grace to let God's love and mercy touch our hearts and bring us closer to him, so that we too can be holy as our Heavenly Father is holy.

Reflexión del Domingo

Juan 6: 60-69

En las lecturas de este Domingo veintiuno del Tiempo Ordinario se nos habla sobre el Pacto, Iglesia, la Real Presencia de Jesús en la Eucaristía, y el compromiso personal que Jesús requiere de sus seguidores.

En la primera lectura Josue pide al pueblo de Dios el hacer su elección entre el Dios de sus padres o los dioses paganos de los amorreos, pero el pueblo decidió seguir al Dios verdadero, es decir, el de sus padres.

En la segunda lectura San Pablo a los Efesios les habla sobre la ideal relación que debe existir entre los miembros de la Iglesia sugiriendo el respeto que debe haber entre los esposos a ejemplo de la fidelidad de Cristo con su Iglesia; así como Cristo ama a su Iglesia, así deben amarse mutuamente los esposos y renovar sus compromisos matrimoniales. Del mismo modo la Iglesia tiene que renovar sus compromisos bautismales con Jesús, y esto es lo que realizamos en cada Misa donde nos unimos a Jesús ya cada uno de sus miembros (Cuerpo Místico de Cristo) celebrando así la unidad con un Jesús que vive Resucitado en medio de nuestra comunidad.

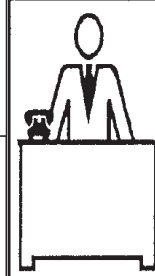
