In Jesus this prophecy is fulfilled. God, through the Messiah, is delivering His people from exile, bringing them back from the ends of the earth, with the blind and lame in their midst. Jesus, as Bartimaeus proclaims, is the long-awaited Son promised to David. Bartimaeus is a symbol of his people, the captive Zion of whom we sing in today's Psalm. His God has done great things for him. All his life has been sown in tears and weeping. Now, he reaps a new life. Bartimaeus, too, should be a sign for us. How often Christ passes us by, in the person of the poor, in the distressing guise of a troublesome family member or burdensome associate (see Matthew 25:31-46) and yet we don't see Him. Christ still calls to us through His Church, as Jesus sent His Apostles to call Bartimaeus. Yet how often are we found to be listening instead to the voices of the crowd, not hearing the words of His Church. Today He asks us what He asks Bartimaeus: "What do you want me to do for you?"

## FEAST OF FAITH—The Sound of Communion

The priest receives Holy Communion, and then there is movement, a bustle of activity, as we prepare to join the Communion procession. This holy meal does not happen in silence! Instead, we sing together even as we rise and move forward in procession to the altar. We must change and move to receive the Eucharist, and fittingly so, since the Eucharist is transformative—it demands action of us, internal as well as external. We do not receive the sacrament in silence, but with a dialogue that is also a profession of faith: "The Body of Christ." "Amen." "The Blood of Christ." "Amen." We acknowledge the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist with our "Amen" of faith, but more, our "Amen" is also a prayer that we may become what we receive, the Body of Christ, living and active in the world. We receive him not that he may become a part of us, but that we may become a part of him—part, too, of all the others who receive him, the whole communion of believers.

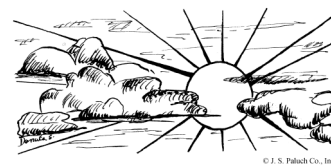

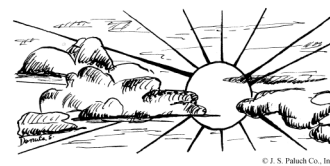

### Reflexión del Domingo

El evangelio de hoy radica en una ironía: es un ciego, Bartimeo, quien se convierte en la primera persona fuera de los apóstoles en reconocer a Jesús como el Mesías. Y su sanación es el último milagro que Jesús realiza antes de entrar en la ciudad santa de Jerusalén para su última semana en la tierra. La escena del camino a Jerusalén evoca la alegre procesión profetizada por Jeremías en la primera lectura de hoy. En Jesús se cumple esta profecía. Dios, a través del Mesías, está liberando a su pueblo del exilio, trayéndolos de regreso de los confines de la tierra, con ciegos y cojos en medio de ellos. Jesús, como proclama Bartimeo, es el Hijo largamente esperado prometido a David; Bartimeo es un símbolo de su pueblo, el cautivo Sión de quien cantamos en el Salmo de hoy. Su Dios ha hecho grandes cosas por él. Toda su vida ha sido sembrada en llanto y llanto. Ahora él siembra una nueva vida. Bartimeo también debería ser una señal para nosotros. Cuántas veces Cristo nos pasa de largo, en la persona de los pobres, con la angustiosa apariencia de un miembro de la familia problemático o un socio agobiante (véase Mateo 25: 31-46), y sin embargo no lo vemos. Cristo todavía nos llama a través de su Iglesia, como Jesús envió a sus apóstoles a llamar a Bartimeo. Sin embargo, ¿con qué frecuencia escuchamos las voces de la multitud, sin escuchar las palabras de Su Iglesia? ## FIESTA DE LA FE — La antigua alianza
