Reflexión del Domingo

La viuda de la primera lectura ni siquiera es judía, pero confía en la palabra de Elías y en la promesa de su Señor. Enfrentando una inanición segura, da todo lo que tiene, su último trozo de comida: alimentar al hombre de Dios antes que ella y su familia. La viuda del Evangelio también da todo lo que tiene, ofreciendo su último dinero para apoyar la obra de los sacerdotes de Dios en el Templo. En su autosacrificio, estas viudas encarnan el amor que Jesús reveló la semana pasada como el corazón de la Ley y el Evangelio. Reflejan el amor del Padre al dar a Su único Hijo, y el amor de Cristo al sacrificarse en la Cruz. Nuevamente en la epístola de hoy, escuchamos a Cristo descrito como un nuevo sumo sacerdote y el siervo sufriente predicho por Isaías. En la cruz, hizo sacrificio de una vez por todas para quitar nuestro pecado y llevarnos a la salvación. Y nuevamente estamos llamados a imitar Su sacrificio de amor en nuestras propias vidas. Seremos juzgados, no por cuánto damos, porque los escribas y los ricos contribuyen mucho más que la viuda. Más bien, seremos juzgados por si nuestros dones reflejan nuestro sustento, todo nuestro ser, todo nuestro corazón y alma, mente y fuerza. ¿Le estamos dando todo lo que podemos al Señor, no por un sentido de deber forzado, sino con un espíritu de generosidad y amor? No temas, nos dice hoy el hombre de Dios. Mientras cantamos en el Salmo de hoy, el Señor proveerá para nosotros, como Él sostiene a la viuda. Sigamos hoy el ejemplo de las viudas, haciendo lo que Dios pide, confiando en que nuestras tinajas de harina no se van a quedar vacías, ni nuestras tinajas de aceite se secan.

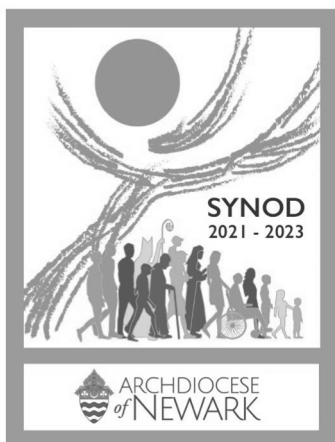

Archdiocese of Newark Launches Synod 2021-2023

The Archdiocese of Newark joined dioceses throughout the world in celebrating a special Opening Mass on October 17 to launch "Synod 2021-2023: For a Synodal Church," a two-year re-examination of the way the Catholic Church is listening to and walking with its parishioners. The Mass was filled with parishioners from the four counties it serves (Bergen, Essex, Hudson, and Union) as well as many clergy, religious women and men, parish pastoral council leaders, and archdiocesan staff members.

During his homily, Cardinal Tobin explained that a "synod" is a global process of discussion and reflection on a topic of particular importance to the Church. The current synod is meant to explore how the Church can improve its ability to collaborate with 21st century Catholics — which is why every parishioner's voice will matter in upcoming listening sessions and discussions.

"It's an effort to open ourselves to a permanent conversion of heart... a change of our Church at all levels," Cardinal Tobin said, adding that the synod's purpose is to "discover the divine will — God's saving plan for us today, in our circumstances, in our time, in our places. And the process of the synod will make the people of God actors in the process of discernment rather than passive onlookers."

Like other dioceses worldwide, the opening Mass was the Archdiocese's first significant step in participating in the worldwide "synod on synodality" initiated by Pope Francis on October 10. Next, the Archdiocese will coordinate listening sessions for its 212 parishes, at which Catholics will be encouraged to share their opinions on what is expected of today's Church. Sessions will be guided by universal questions for dioceses worldwide examining the perceptions of today's Catholics.

In April, the Archdiocese will gather, analyze, and synthesize information from all parish listening sessions into one report that will be submitted to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB). Similarly, dioceses across the U.S. and globally will submit their local findings, which will ultimately be consolidated into reports for discussion among the world's bishops and the Vatican to help guide Pope Francis on decisions about how the Church should proceed in the future.

Sunday's Reflection

The widow in the First Reading isn't even a Jew, yet she trusts in the word of Elijah and the promise of his Lord. Facing sure starvation, she gives all that she has, her last bit of food, feeding the man of God before herself and her family. The widow in the Gospel also gives all that she has, offering her last bit of money to support the work of God's priests in the Temple. In their self-sacrifice, these widows embody the love that Jesus last week revealed as the heart of the Law and the Gospel. They mirror the Father's love in giving His only Son, and Christ's love in sacrificing Himself on the Cross. Again in today's Epistle, we hear Christ described as a new high priest and the suffering servant foretold by Isaiah. On the Cross, He made sacrifice once and for all to take away our sin and bring us to salvation. And again we are called to imitate His sacrifice of love in our own lives. We will be judged, not by how much we give, for the scribes and the

wealthy contribute far more than the widow. Rather, we will be judged by whether our gifts reflect our livelihood, our whole beings, all our heart and soul, mind and strength. Are we giving all that we can to the Lord: not out of a sense of forced duty, but in a spirit of generosity and love? Do not be afraid, the man of God tells us today. As we sing in today's Psalm, the Lord will provide for us, as He sustains the widow. Today, let us follow the widows' example, doing what God asks, confident that our jars of flour will not grow empty, nor our jugs of oil run dry.

THE POOR

As Christians, we hear a lot about the witness and service that we are called to render to the poor among us. However, the poor also have a witness and a service to render to us. Like the actions of the widow in today's Gospel, the openness and generosity of many of those who are poor, even in the midst of their own poverty, bear witness to the fact that, ultimately, we can depend only on God. Giving one's all witnesses that God will give all to anyone who trusts in divine goodness. The poor or disadvantaged also serve. They serve judgment on our individual and corporate ways of acting. If people are sleeping in our streets, that is a judgment on our priorities regarding others. At the same time, the poor can act as mediators of salvation. When they care for others they can redeem our indifference and insensibility, lead us to care as well, and save us from ourselves.

Concluding Rites

The Prayer after Communion gives us a glimpse of the heavenly banquet, of which we have had a foretaste in the Eucharist. The concluding rites speak of what we are to do with this great gift of God. That includes the parish announcements, which are usually given following the Prayer after Communion. Believe it or not, the announcements, which are not an "official" part of the Mass, have been included in the Mass from as early as the fifth century! The deacon or the homilist—even the bishop—would announce coming liturgical celebrations and encourage the people to participate. Today's parish announcements include opportunities for prayer, service, learning, and community building. They should be succinct and should include only significant events and activities in the life of the parish. But even when they are long and tedious, the announcements (and the parish bulletin) flow out of the concluding rites of the Mass. They offer us ways to live the Eucharist, to become what we have received—the Body of Christ, living and active in our local community.
