33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Marcos 13, 24-32

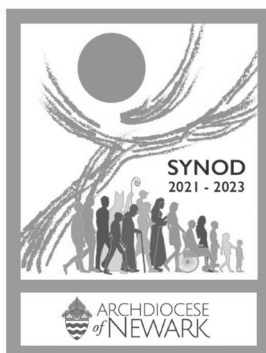
Faced with a confused and pluralistic, violent, dehumanizing world and burdened by the many changes and problems that humanity is going through, man needs to assert, consolidate and clarify himself in the face of the threats of cyber wars, global warming, climatic detriments, and a pandemic that threatens health, the economy and the decimation and detriment of families and the human race. These situation can lead to despair and many times, to mental and psychological imbalances. Man needs to calm down and train himself to face such threats, so as not to get discouraged and lose the meaning of his life, his family and the world in which he lives.

In the midst of all these things he faces before the mysteries of life and death; the final trance of existence for which we as a Christian have to be prepared, consolidating ourselves in the certainty of the Resurrection of Jesus who sacrificed himself on the cross to redeem us from sin and eternal death. The Prophet Daniel tells us in the First Reading: "Many of those who sleep in the dust will wake up: some for eternal life, others for eternal punishment. But the righteous, the Good will shine like the splendor of the firmament, and those who taught many righteousness, shine like stars for all eternity."

We have the promise of salvation if we have been and have abided by the Lord's commandments.

In the Gospel of Mark today, Jesus speaks to the Apostles and to us: "After the days of the great tribulation the light of the sun will go out, the moon will not shine, the stars will fall from the sky and the whole universe will be moved. Then you will see the Son of Man coming upon the clouds with great power and majesty. And He will send His angels to gather His elect from all the ends of the earth. Understand this and be prepared when you see these signs."

Mark, the Evangelist is exhorting the community of that time and us today to be prepared and vigilant because no one knows the day or the hour, but to live in God's grace and in that constant openness to God's love and to our brothers and sisters in need. This implies a practical life of rectitude, honesty and Christian virtues that give us security and confidence in what we believe and expect.

Archdiocese of Newark Launches Synod 2021-2023

The Archdiocese of Newark joined dioceses throughout the world in celebrating a special Opening Mass on October 17 to launch "Synod 2021-2023: For a Synodal Church," a two-year re-examination of the way the Catholic Church is listening to and walking with its parishioners.

The Mass was filled with parishioners from the four counties it serves (Bergen, Essex, Hudson, and Union) as well as many clergy, religious women and men, parish pastoral council leaders, and archdiocesan staff members.

During his homily, Cardinal Tobin explained that a "synod" is a global process of discussion and reflection on a topic of particular importance to the Church. The current synod is meant to explore how the Church can improve its ability to collaborate with 21st century Catholics — which is why every parishioner's voice will matter in upcoming listening sessions and discussions.

"It's an effort to open ourselves to a permanent conversion of heart... a change of our Church at all levels," Cardinal Tobin said, adding that the synod's purpose is to "discover the divine will — God's saving plan for us today, in our circumstances, in our time, in our places. And the process of the synod will make the people of God actors in the process of discernment rather than passive onlookers."

Like other dioceses worldwide, the opening Mass was the Archdiocese's first significant step in participating in the worldwide "synod on synodality" initiated by Pope Francis on October 10. Next, the Archdiocese will coordinate listening sessions for its 212 parishes, at which Catholics will be encouraged to share their opinions on what is expected of today's Church. Sessions will be guided by universal questions for dioceses worldwide examining the perceptions of today's Catholics.

In April, the Archdiocese will gather, analyze, and synthesize information from all parish listening sessions into one report that will be submitted to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB). Similarly, dioceses across the U.S. and globally will submit their local findings, which will ultimately be consolidated into reports for discussion among the world's bishops and the Vatican to help guide Pope Francis on decisions about how the Church should proceed in the future.

Blessing and Dismissal

At the beginning of Mass, the priest made the sign of the cross with us. At the conclusion of Mass, he makes the sign of the cross over us, a sign of blessing. We are then dismissed—not just let out, but sent forth with a mission "to love and serve the Lord." Just as Jesus blessed his disciples as he ascended to heaven, so this leave-taking is joined to a blessing, a prayer for God's continuing protection. As we leave the church, we bear the invisible sign of the Master whom we follow. In the words of an ancient letter to Diognetus, "Christians are indistinguishable from other [people] either by nationality, language, or customs. They do not inhabit separate cities of their own, or speak a strange dialect, or follow an outlandish way of life. . . . And yet, there is something extraordinary about their lives" (*Liturgy of the Hours*, Vol. II, p. 840). We are ordinary people sent forth to live extraordinary lives, lives like Christ's own life—pouring ourselves out for others in prayer, service, and love. —Corinna Laughlin, Copyright © J. S. 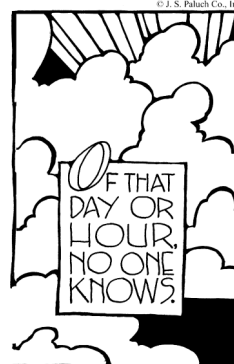

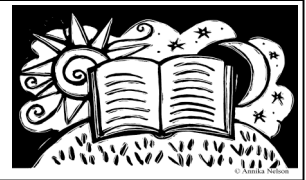

Tenemos la promesa de la salvación si hemos sido y hemos cumplido los mandamientos del Señor.

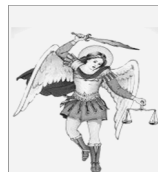
