Jesus our King

Do you know what a king is? He is someone who is known to everyone, who has fame, money, and power. In Jesus' time, it was no different. When Jesus was arrested and put on trial. The Jews denounced Jesus claiming to be a king just to make sure he had a crime to be tried for. Their king was Herod. Jesus answered Pilate, "You ask me because others have told you. But my kingdom is not of this world. It was clear that this kingdom does not work like the kingdoms here.

Many people asked Jesus questions, but they did not understand him. There are still people who ask Christians about the power and influence we can have in this world. Others, rightly or wrongly, assume that we have yet not understood a little about the kingdom and power of God, and get to judge us, but one thing we can't deny is that His Kingdom is different from the conventional one.

Jesus proposes a kingdom of love, and he says it with such power that he convinces even the Roman judge.

Imagine a person who is very important in your life, either a man or a woman, someone close to you. You decide to give this person you have thought of everything necessary to make him king: Jewels, a crown, chariots, and many material things. Now, ask yourself if this person, as you have imagined them, looks like Jesus.

The answer is simple: the Kingdom of God is not what we imagine. It is a state of simplicity, surrender, love, and willingness to do the Father's will in everything and everyone.

Let's say: Jesus, I want to be like you; I don't want jewels, applause, or recognition; I want to be the servant, I want to love and give myself for the kingdom of heaven.

CHRIST, THE KING

The selection from the book of Daniel presented in today's first reading was part of an attempt to weave a vision of ultimate success for the Jews under persecution. Exactly whom the author had in mind when he refers to "one like a Son of Man" is hotly disputed by scholars today. The fact is, we simply do not know if the author meant anyone in particular or if this is a collective, figurative image of Israel's triumph. What we do know is that the early Christian community seized upon this passage and recognized it as a messianic prophecy, a foretelling of the ultimate triumph of Jesus as the Christ of God. The Lectionary's juxtaposition of this text with today's Gospel narrative of Jesus before Pilate is a wonderful example of how the liturgy "layers" passages with new meaning by inserting them in a particular context.

The celebration of Christ the King allows us to hear these passages with a new depth of meaning in light of our contemporary understanding of how, in Jesus and his resurrection and ascension, we have seen the fulfillment of Daniel's vision of ultimate deliverance. The veiled admission of Jesus before Pilate that he did indeed have a kingdom "not here" takes on new meaning against the cosmic vision of Daniel, who allows us to glimpse the "Ancient One" on his heavenly throne.

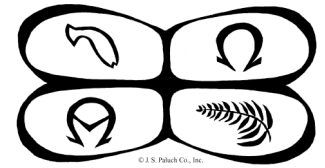

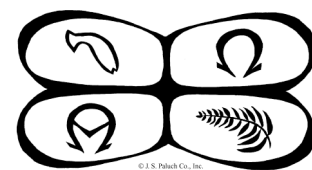

Jesus Nuestro Rey

¿Sabes lo que es un rey? Él es alguien que es conocido por todos, que tiene fama, dinero y poder. En los tiempos de Jesús, no era diferente. Cuando Jesús fue arrestado y sometido a juicio los judíos denunciaron a Jesús por estar diciendo que era un rey, sólo para asegurarse de que tenían un crimen para juzgarlo. Su rey era Herodes. Jesús respondió a Pilato: Me preguntas porque otros te lo han dicho. Pero mi reino no es de este mundo. Estaba claro que este reino no funciona como los reinos aquí.

Muchas personas le hicieron preguntas a Jesús, pero no lo entendieron. Todavía hay personas que preguntan a los cristianos sobre el poder y la influencia que podemos tener en este mundo. Otros, con razón o sin ella, asumen que aún no hemos entendido un poco sobre el reino y el poder de Dios, y llegan a juzgarnos, pero una cosa que no podemos negar es que Su Reino es diferente del convencional.

Jesús propone un reino de amor, y lo dice con tal poder que pudo convencer incluso al juez romano.

Imagina a una persona que es muy importante en tu vida, ya sea un hombre o una mujer, alguien cercano a ti. Tu decides darle a esta persona todo lo necesario para hacerlo rey: joyas, una corona, carros y muchas cosas materiales. Ahora, pregúntate si esta persona como lo has imaginado ¿se parece a Jesús?

La respuesta es simple: el Reino de Dios no es lo que imaginamos. Es un estado de sencillez, entrega, amor y deseo de hacer la voluntad del Padre en todo y en todos.

Digamos: "Jesús, quiero ser como tú; No quiero joyas, aplausos ni reconocimientos; Quiero ser el siervo, quiero amar y entregarme al reino de los cielos."

CRISTO REY

La selección del libro de Daniel para la primera lectura de hoy forma parte de un intento de tejer una visión del éxito final de los judíos perseguidos. Exactamente qué tenía el autor en mente cuando se refiere a “uno semejante a un Hijo de hombre” es muy disputado por los eruditos de hoy. El hecho es que, simplemente, no sabemos si el autor quiso decir a alguien en particular o si se trata de una imagen colectiva, figurativa del triunfo de Israel. Lo que sí sabemos es que la primera comunidad cristiana se apoderó de este pasaje y lo reconoció como una profecía mesiánica, un anuncio de la victoria final de Jesús como el Cristo de Dios. El contraste que hace el leccionario de este texto con la narrativa del Evangelio de hoy de Jesús ante Pilato es un maravilloso ejemplo de cómo la liturgia da a ciertos pasajes nuevas “capas” de significado mediante la inserción en un contexto particular.

La celebración de Cristo Rey nos permite escuchar estos pasajes con una nueva profundidad de significado a la luz de nuestra comprensión contemporánea de cómo, en Jesús y su Resurrección y Ascensión, hemos visto el cumplimiento de la visión de Daniel de la liberación final. La admisión velada de Jesús ante Pilato que, efectivamente, él tenía un reino pero “no aquí” toma un nuevo significado con la visión cósmica de Daniel sirviendo de fondo, que nos permite vislumbrar al “Anciano” en su trono celestial.
