Pope Francis, with the Apostolic Letter *Patris corde* –With the heart of a father–, dedicated a whole year to Saint Joseph, from December 8, 2020 to December 8, 2021, reminding us that he is the patron of the universal Church.

The jubilee year of Saint Joseph, patron of our parish, helped us to know more about his person, discreet and full of virtues.

A year ago, when the Holy Father announced this jubilee to us, we drew up a plan that we developed to the extent that the situation of the pandemic that we are experiencing allowed us. Definitely, the activities prepared served to venerate the figure of Saint Joseph and also to bring many parishioners back to the church and prove that we could safely gather for prayer and praise, and attend the regular services of our church of Saint Joseph of Palisades.

The first event that managed to motivate and bring several hundred families around the figure of Saint Joseph was the novena that the 450 families of the religious education program prayed in his honor. Each class met virtually, the families prayed in their homes for 8 sessions and on the ninth day they attended the special ceremony in which our church was decorated, they prayed the last day of the novena and in an emotional act the families of the program were consecrated to the protection of Saint Joseph.

Throughout the year, catechesis, retreats, prayer to Saint Joseph at the end of each mass, the celebration of the patron saint festivities on March 19, confession, among others, were the activities that were experienced in Saint Joseph of the Palisades to avail themselves of the gift of special indulgences.

The closing of this Holy Year coincided with the celebration of the Immaculate Conception, a day that gave us the opportunity to celebrate Mary and her chaste husband Joseph in a great spiritual feast that included a concert of music alluding to the two and a mass concelebrated by the pastor Rev. Helber Victoria, Father Edinson Ramirez, Father Richard DeBrasi and Father Jose Luis Soto.

Some benefits earned in this jubilee can be noted, although there will be many others that only the devotees of Saint Joseph will be able to count. The first is that after a year we were able to return to a normal attendance at the regular scheduled services and today we have a full house at the 13 Sunday Masses that we are celebrated in Saint Joseph.

Children, youth and adults who know more and who approached the devotion to Saint Joseph with more fervor are seeds that were sown in this holy year and we hope that they will bear fruit in this new year that we are beginning.

This great initiative by Pope Francis has helped strengthen faith, brought hope and holds the community of Saint Joseph of the Palisades together in this time of pandemic.

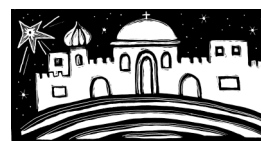

JOURNEY TOWARD GOD

In our celebration of the Epiphany, two interwoven themes are present in the readings today. God is beginning something new, and God gathers all of humanity to participate. For Isaiah, God's bright light, manifested in the people of Israel, attracts and summons people from many nations to Jerusalem. In the letter to the Ephesians, God's grace makes the Gentiles co-heirs and co-partners in the gospel. Matthew tells the story of the fulfillment of God's promises to Israel through the birth of Jesus, and simultaneously leading foreigners to share in these same promises. With the birth of Jesus, God chose a particular people, in a particular time and place, to enter most directly into the human story. Today's readings teach that God did this in order to gather all people, all cultures, into unity with God. Like the magi, we are drawn into a journey toward God, becoming co-partners in God's work.

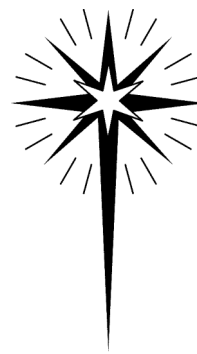

El Papa Francisco, con la Carta Apostólica *Patris corde* – Con corazón de padre –, dedicó todo un año a San José, desde el 8 de diciembre del 2020 hasta el 8 de diciembre del 2021, recordándonos que él es el patrono de la Iglesia universal.

El año jubilar de San José, patrono de nuestra parroquia, nos ayudó a conocer más su persona, discreta y llena de virtudes.

Hace un año, cuando el Santo Padre nos anunció este jubileo, trazamos un plan que desarrollamos en la medida que nos permitió la situación de la pandemia que vivimos. Definitivamente, las actividades preparadas sirvieron para venerar la figura de San José y también para que regresasen a la iglesia muchos feligreses y probar que podíamos reunirnos con seguridad para la oración y la alabanza, y asistir a los servicios regulares de nuestra iglesia de San José de Palisades.

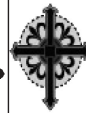

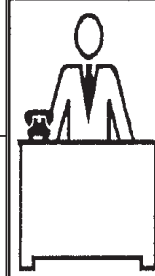
