Con esta celebración especial del Bautismo del Señor, la Iglesia nos invita en primer lugar a reflexionar sobre nuestro propio Bautismo, recordar aquel momento en el que iniciamos nuestra vida cristiana con la bendición del Sacramento y el seguimiento del Señor Jesús; ese mismo Jesús que la iglesia también nos muestra en su humildad siguiendo la voluntad divina, recibiendo el Bautizo de manos de Juan el Bautista.

San Gregorio Nacianceno en uno de sus sermons nos dice: "Juan está bautizando, y Cristo se acerca; tal vez para santificar al mismo por quien va a ser bautizado; y sin duda para sepultar en las aguas a todo el viejo Adán, santificando el Jordán antes de nosotros y por nuestra causa; y así, el Señor, que era espíritu y carne, nos consagra mediante el Espíritu y el agua".

Solemnity of the Baptism of the Lord

Dear Brothers in the Lord, Life and Love:

This weekend on our second Sunday of the year, we are accompanied by a great liturgical celebration that brings us to the end of this liturgical season of Christmas in our Catholic Church: The Solemnity of the Baptism of the Lord.

With this special celebration of the Baptism of the Lord, the Church invites us to reflect on our own Baptism, to remember that moment when we began our Christian life with the blessing of the Sacrament and the following of the Lord Jesus; that same Jesus that the church also shows us in his humility following the divine will, receiving the Baptism from the hands of John the Baptist.

St. Gregory of Nazianzus in one of his sermons tells us: "John is baptizing, and Christ is approaching; perhaps to sanctify himself by whom he is to be baptized; and surely to bury all the old Adam in the waters, sanctifying the Jordan before us and for our cause; and so the Lord, who was spirit and flesh, consecrates us through the Spirit and water."

The Baptism of the Lord connects us with that ineffable, deep, tireless and wonderful love of the Father with his Beloved Son "This is my beloved Son, in whom I am pleased" (Mt 3:17) and through Him with all of humanity, with each one of us. It is during this time and this celebration that some people wonder why Jesus decided to be baptized and what meaning this baptism has for us.

So, faced with the question, why was Jesus baptized? The Catechism of the Catholic Church (paragraph 536) states: "The baptism of Jesus is for his part the acceptance and inauguration of his mission as a suffering Servant. He allows himself to be counted among sinners; he is already "the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world." He already anticipates the "baptism" of his bloody death. He already comes to "fulfill all righteousness," that is, he is entirely subjecting himself to the will of his Father: By love he accepts the baptism of death for the remission of our sins. The voice of the Father who puts all his complacency in his Son responds to this acceptance. The Spirit that Jesus possesses in its fullness from conception comes to "pose" upon Him. This Spirit will command him for all mankind. At His baptism, the heavens were "opened" that Adam's sin had closed; and the waters were sanctified and the waters were sanctified by the descent of Jesus and the Spirit as a prelude to the new creation."

Let us therefore join in the joy, the constant newness and happiness of the Church this 2022 on the Solemnity of the Baptism of the Lord. May this celebration infuse into our hearts the fire of his Spirit and inspire us to walk in the New Year with wonderful hope and rejoicing.

BAPTISMAL DEATH AND RESURRECTION

As we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord, we also honor our own baptism as our initiation into the Christian life and community. In the Gospel, the baptism of Jesus, with his immersion and then emergence from the water, points to his later submission to God at his death, and his emergence from the grave at his resurrection. This pattern of death and resurrection is our path too, as followers of Jesus. Throughout life, often in small ways, we learn to surrender our limited and self-centered agendas. This surrender often feels like death. The sacrament of Baptism ritually enacts this pattern to remind us of Jesus' death and resurrection, so that we too might embrace the deaths and resurrections of our own lives. As Jesus emerged from the water, he encountered his Father and the Holy Spirit. Like Jesus, we can know we are God's beloved, empowered by the Spirit. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

For True Human Fraternity – January Reflection

We pray for all those suffering from religious discrimination and persecution; may their own rights and dignity be recognized, which originate from being brothers and sisters in the human family.

Fraternity is a marriage of love and faith. It calls us to be compassionate and drives us forward to recognize our brothers and sisters to the fullest capacity regardless of religious, socioeconomic or other status. A call not only to recognize God given dignity but to honor it. In Galatians 5:13 Christ compels us to use our freedom to serve one another through love. A love that is made manifest in fraternal love and mutual respect.

In an introduction to A Document on Human Fraternity signed by Pope Francis in 2019, it reads, "Faith leads a believer to see in the other a brother or sister to be supported and loved. Through faith in God, who has created the universe, creatures and all human beings (equal on account of his mercy), believers are called to express this human fraternity by safeguarding creation and the entire universe and supporting all persons, especially the poorest and those most in need."

Practicing compassionate and true fraternity calls us to suffer with those who face persecution, poverty, and isolation. A call to be present to the body of Christ in a world rife with indifference. Let us pray that God enlivens our hearts and unites us in our common humanity.

A esta aceptación responde la voz del Padre que pone toda su complacencia en su Hijo. El Espíritu que Jesús posee en plenitud desde su concepción viene a "posarse" sobre él. De él manará este Espíritu para toda la humanidad. En su bautismo, "se abrieron los cielos" que el pecado de Adán había cerrado; y las aguas fueron santificadas por el descenso de Jesús y del Espíritu como preludio de la nueva creación".

Unamos pues al júbilo, constante novedad y alegría de la Iglesia en este 2022 en la Solemnidad del Bautismo del Señor, que esta celebración infunde en nuestros corazones el fuego de su Espíritu y nos inspire a caminar en el Año Nuevo con maravillosa esperanza y regocijo.
