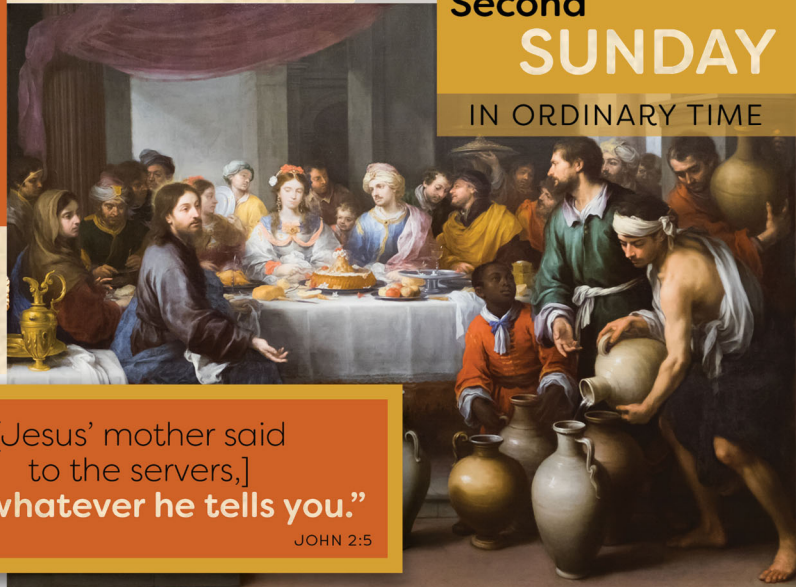

# The Wedding Made in Heaven

We can think of these first weeks after Christmas as a season of epiphanies. An epiphany is a *manifestation or revelation*. The liturgy is showing us who Jesus is and what He has *revealed* about our relationship with God. Last week and the week before, the imagery was royal and filial—Jesus




is the newborn king of the Jews who makes us coheirs of Israel’s promise, beloved children of God. Last week in the liturgy we went to a baptism. This week we’re at a wedding. We’re being shown another dimension of our relationship with God. If we’re sons and daughters of God, it’s because we’ve married into the family. Have you ever wondered why the Bible begins and ends with a wedding; Adam and Eve’s in the garden and the marriage supper of the Lamb. Throughout the Bible, marriage is the symbol of the covenant relationship God desires with His chosen people. He is the groom, humanity His beloved and sought after bride. We see this


reflected beautifully in today’s First Reading. When Israel breaks the covenant, she is compared to an unfaithful spouse. But God promises to take her back, to “espouse” her to Him forever in an everlasting covenant. That’s why in today’s Gospel Jesus performs His first public “sign” at a wedding feast. Jesus is the divine bridegroom, calling us to His royal wedding feast. By His New Covenant, He will become “one flesh” with all humanity in the Church. By our baptism, each of us has been betrothed to Christ as a bride to a husband. The new wine that Jesus pours out at today’s feast is the gift of the Holy Spirit given to His bride and body, as today’s Epistle says.

### REVELATION OF GOD'S PRESENCE

Today's first reading from Isaiah arises out of the ordeal of the people of Jerusalem and Judea as they anticipate the end of seventy years of exile in Babylon. Their sufferings and their oppression will end, and they are promised joy like that of a great wedding upon returning to their homeland. Although this passage is probably set in the early sixth century B.C., it is free of historical particulars. Accordingly, the Church has understood its imagery universally, as it proclaims God's promise of healing, hope, and happiness for all peoples, in this world and in the next. When read against this background, the story of Jesus' turning water into wine at the wedding at Cana becomes a revelation of God's presence in the person of Jesus, making these promises real for us in the here and now, in the transformation of our own lives.

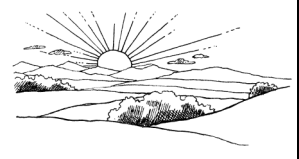

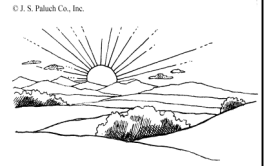

La semana pasada y la semana anterior, la imagería era real y filial: Jesús es el rey recién nacido de los judíos que nos



hace herederos de la promesa de Israel, amados hijos de Dios. La semana pasada en la liturgia estuvimos en un bautizo. Esta semana estamos invitados a una boda. Se nos muestra otra dimensión de nuestra relación con Dios. Si somos hijos e hijas de Dios, es porque nos hemos casado en la familia. ¿Alguna vez te has preguntado por qué la Biblia comienza y termina con una boda, como Adán y Eva en el jardín, y la cena de las bodas del Cordero? A lo largo de la Biblia, el matrimonio es el símbolo de la relación

de pacto que Dios desea con su pueblo escogido. Él es el novio, la humanidad Su novia amada y buscada. Vemos esto reflejado bellamente en la Primera Lectura de hoy. Cuando Israel rompe el pacto, se la compara con un cónyuge infiel. Pero Dios promete recuperarla, “desposarla” con Él para siempre en un pacto eterno. Por eso, en el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús realiza Su primer “signo” público en una fiesta de bodas. Jesús es el novio divino, llamándonos a Su banquete de boda real. Por Su Nuevo Pacto, Él llegará a ser “una sola carne” con toda la humanidad en la Iglesia. Por nuestro bautismo, cada uno de nosotros ha sido desposado con Cristo como una novia con un esposo. El vino nuevo que Jesús derrama en la fiesta de hoy es el don del Espíritu Santo dado a su esposa y cuerpo, como dice la Epístola de hoy.
