Third Sunday in Ordinary Time. Cycle C

Neh. 8:2-4, 5-6, 8-10; 1 Cor 12:12-30; Luk 1:1-4, 4:14-21

This Sunday's readings relate the first reading to the Gospel. The Babylonian exiles listened to Ezdra read the book of the Law and the people's joyful response was: "Amen, Amen." In the synagogue of Nazareth Jesus reads a passage from the Mesanic prophecies of Isaiah that concludes that in Him the scriptures have been fulfilled.

We know that the people, the religious authorities of the scribes and Pharisees, rejected Him. But these readings relate to the nature of our Church. St. Paul uses the analogy of the human body to help the Corinthians and us understand the relationship between Christ and us, His mystical body: "The body is one and has many members, and each of them is part of the mystical body of Christ, His Church. Therefore everyone must worry about their brother.

Since the human body has principles of life, so too the soul and the body of Christ. The same Holy Spirit who lives in Christ also lives in us and in each of the members of Christ's Mystical Body, His Church, in which each member has a function to fulfill according to the gifts God has given him. Each of us by baptism is part of this Mystical Body of Christ, His Church in which each member has its mission to accomplish for the growth of this church and for his own personal sanctification, helping Christ in the sanctification of its members. Each of us baptized has a responsibility to build the Church of Christ with our holiness and life.

The motto of the Click To Pray app is "Together, we make each day different." The Pope's Worldwide Prayer Network (Apostleship of Prayer) launched the app globally in March 2016 in English, Spanish, Portuguese and French. Tercer Domingo en Tiempo Ordinario. Ciclo C

Neh 8: 2-4,5-6,8-10, 1 Cor 12:12-30, Luk 1:1-4; 4:14-21

Las lecturas de este Domingo se relacionan la primera lectura con el evangelio. Los exiliados de Babilonia escuchan a Ezdra leer el libro de la Ley y la respuesta del pueblo alegremente es: "Amen, amen." En la sinagoga de Nazareth, su pueblo natal, Jesús lee un pasaje de las profecías mesánicas de Isaías que concluye diciendo que en Él se han cumplido las escrituras.

Sabemos que el pueblo las autoridades religiosas escribas y fariseos lo rechazaron. Pero estas lecturas guardan una relación con la naturaleza de nuestra Iglesia. San Pablo usa la analogía del cuerpo humano para ayudar a los corintios y a nosotros a entender la relación entre Cristo y nosotros su cuerpo místico: "El cuerpo es uno y tiene muchos miembros y cada uno de ellos forma parte del cuerpo místico de Cristo, su Iglesia. Por ende cada uno debe preocuparse del hermano.

Como el cuerpo humano tiene principios de vida, el alma, también el cuerpo de Cristo. El mismo Espíritu Santo que vive en Cristo también vive en nosotros y en cada uno de los miembros del Cuerpo Místico de Cristo, su Iglesia, en ella cada miembro tiene una función que cumplir según los dones que Dios le ha dado. Cada uno de nosotros por el bautismo formamos parte de este Cuerpo Místico de Cristo, su Iglesia en la cual cada miembro tiene su misión que realizar para el engrandecimiento de esta iglesia y por la propia santificación personal, ayudando a Cristo en la santificación de los miembros de ella. Cada uno de nosotros los bautizados tenemos la responsabilidad de construir la Iglesia de Cristo con nuestra santidad e vida.

LA LEY DE DIOS

La Escritura siempre ha sostenido que la ley de Dios es el camino para la felicidad humana. En la primera lectura, el sacerdote Esdras lee el rollo de la ley al pueblo que regresó del exilio. El pueblo llora y luego se alegra. La relación de Israel con Dios siempre se ha definido por cómo guardaba y vivía la ley de Dios. El autor del salmo 96 también alaba la ley de Dios como el origen de la sabiduría, alegría e iluminación, pureza y justicia. En su consejo con los corintios discutidores, Pablo señala que, al igual que Dios ha hecho todas las partes del cuerpo humano esenciales para la salud integral, vivir como "el cuerpo de Cristo" requiere que cada miembro sea reconocido como necesario para el bien de todos. Por último, en el Evangelio de Lucas, Jesús afirma que el Espíritu lo envía a aliviar el sufrimiento humano. Como Esdras, quien está leyendo de un rollo, proclamando la
