Reflexión del Domingo

Sigamos aprendiendo sobre la vida de Jesús a través del evangelista Lucas. Si te ayuda, cierra los ojos, respira muy lentamente e imagina que eres bienvenido con Dios en su ciudad natal.

La semana pasada leímos que Jesús recorrió la región de Galilea para enseñar y predicar. Podemos imaginar que se había

convertido en algo así como una celebridad o persona influyente en su región. Luego regresó a su ciudad natal de Nazaret, y la gente allí se emocionó inicialmente porque dijeron que era un profeta y hablaba con autoridad de Dios. ¿Notaste que la autoridad no era actuar grosero o desagradable, sino estar en lo cierto y estar convencido de que todo lo que dijo era tan cierto como él? Pero paradójicamente, el Evangelio nos dice que Jesús mismo dijo que los profetas no fueron enviados a sus tierras natales, y da el ejemplo de algunos proverbios y del profeta que fue enviado a una viuda en una tierra lejana, Y fueron estas palabras las que preocuparon a su pueblo porque algo muy interesante estaba pasando con los judíos; pensaban que las cosas buenas de Dios eran sólo para ellos. De modo que los judíos lo sacaron de la ciudad y esto lo decepcionó un poco, porque siempre fue muy receptivo a hablar a los suyos acerca de las obras de Dios el Padre.

Hoy, Jesús te invita a ser el mensaje que trae de Dios. Te pide que no lo saques de la gente y de tu vida. Porque el mensaje y las buenas nuevas no son solo para personas de cierto tipo, sino para el mundo entero. Jesús siempre hablaba del amor, nada era más importante para él. Jesús vino a llevar el mensaje de Dios a todos nosotros para tranquilizar a los que tenían miedo, para liberar a los oprimidos, para inspirar a los que estaban deprimidos y desesperados, para poner su vida al servicio de los pobres.

Repita: *Hoy, Señor, quiero ir a donde no te permitieron ir, quiero levantar mi voz donde fuiste silenciado.*

Sunday Reflexión

Let's continue learning about the life of Jesus through the Evangelist Luke. If it helps, close your eyes, breathe very slowly, and imagine that you are welcome with God in His hometown.

Last week, we read that Jesus went around the region of Galilee to teach and preach. We can imagine that he had become something of a celebrity or influential person in his region. Then he returned to his hometown of Nazareth, and the people there were initially excited because they said he was a prophet and spoke with the authority of God. Did you notice that authority was not about being rude or unkind, but about being right and being convinced that everything he said was as true as he was? But paradoxically, the Gospel tells us that Jesus himself said that the prophets were not sent to their hometowns, and he gives the example of some proverbs and the prophet who was sent to a widow in a faraway land, and it was these words that troubled his people because something very interesting was going on with the Jews, they thought that the good things of God were only for them. So, the Jews took him out of town and disappointed him a little, because he was always very receptive to telling his own about the deeds of God the Father.

Today, Jesus invites you to be the message he brings of God. He asks you not to take it out of people, not out of your life. Because the message and the good news is not only for people of a certain kind, but for the whole world. Jesus always spoke about love, nothing else was important for him. Jesus came to bring the message of God to all of us, to reassure those who were afraid, to liberate those who were oppressed, to inspire those who were depressed and in despair, to put His life at the service of the poor.

Repeat after me: *Today, Lord, I want to go where you were not allowed to go, I want to raise my voice where you were silenced.*

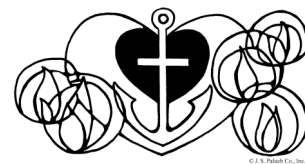

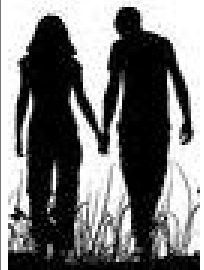

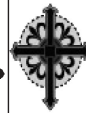
