NATIONAL MARRIAGE WEEK (FEB 7-14)

Marriage is the strongest and most honorable way to achieve stability, security and trust.

Marriage is the intimate union and mutual giving of life between a man and a woman for the purpose of seeking mutual good in all. This relationship has its roots in the original will of God who, by creating man and woman in his image and likeness, gave them the ability to love and give themselves to each other, to the point of being able to be "one flesh" (see Gn. 1, 22 and 2, 24).

Thus, marriage is both a natural institution and a sacred union that fulfills God's original plan for the couple. But Christ also elevated this vocation to love for the dignity of a sacrament when he made the consent to Christian spouses the very symbol of his own self-giving for all on the cross.

In other words, the free consent by which the couple gives and receives each other is the essence or "matter" of the sacrament of marriage, just as bread and wine are the matter of the sacrament of the Eucharist. This consent or visible symbol of the presence of Christ is concretized, within the marriage rite, in the formula that spouses say to each other once and forever with words such as: "I receive you as a spouse and I promise to love you, respect and serve you, in health or sickness, in sadness and joy, in wealth or in poverty, until death do us part".

In our parish of St Joseph, we prepare, guide and celebrate the sacrament of marriage with great emphasis on premarital education.

It does not limit us to the sacrament of marriage, we note that in our community we have young people and adults who need to receive the sacraments of initiation and after a preparation process that is often parallel to the premarital one, they receive all the sacraments of initiation or one of them.

In this National Week of Marriages, we salute the exemplary marriages of our community, as the root of the family and domestic church.

I invite you to pray for married couples, intercede for young people who are preparing in the premarital programs and motivate our children to think about the unique meaning of marriage between a man and a woman as a sign of Christ and his bride, the Church.

**Black History Month Celebrated
 with Special Masses
 Parish Communities Also Invited to Join
 Synod Listening Sessions**

The Archdiocese of Newark's African American, African, and Caribbean Apostolate will celebrate Black History Month with four special Masses and Synod listening sessions during the month of February.

Though the Archdiocese traditionally commemorates Black History Month with one large Mass celebrated by Cardinal Joseph W. Tobin, C.Ss.R., Archbishop of Newark, in Newark's Cathedral Basilica of the Sacred Heart, this year the Apostolate decided to celebrate with four smaller Masses in local parishes to make the celebration more accessible and personal for parishioners. One Mass will be held in each of the four counties overseen by the Archdiocese — Bergen, Essex, Hudson, and Union — with the county's bishop presiding. All are invited to attend to honor Black culture and its impact on American history.

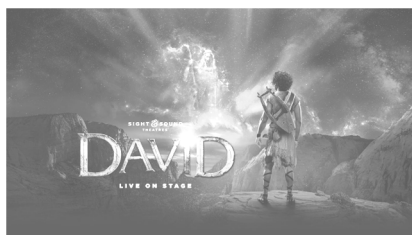

may feel your presence in my soul.*

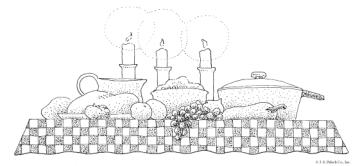

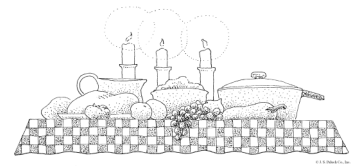

SEMANA NACIONAL DE LOS MATRIMONIOS (FEB 7-14)

El matrimonio es la forma más sólida y honorable de lograr estabilidad, seguridad y confianza.

El matrimonio es la íntima unión y la entrega mutua de la vida entre un hombre y una mujer con el propósito de buscar en todo el bien mutuo. Dicha relación tiene sus raíces en la voluntad original de Dios quien al crear al hombre y a la mujer a su imagen y semejanza, les dio la capacidad de amarse y entregarse mutuamente, hasta el punto de poder ser “una sola carne” (véase Gn. 1, 22 y 2, 24).

Así, el matrimonio es tanto una institución natural como una unión sagrada que realiza el plan original de Dios para la pareja. Pero además Cristo elevó esta vocación al amor a la dignidad de sacramento cuando hizo del consentimiento de entrega de los esposos cristianos el símbolo mismo de su propia entrega por todos en la cruz.

En otras palabras, el consentimiento libre por el cual la pareja se entrega y se recibe mutuamente es la esencia o “materia” del sacramento del matrimonio, de la misma forma como el pan y el vino son la materia del sacramento de la Eucaristía. Dicho consentimiento o símbolo visible de la presencia de Cristo se concretiza, dentro del rito matrimonial, en la fórmula que una vez y para siempre se dicen los esposos con palabras como: “Yo te recibo como esposo(a) y me comprometo a amarte, respetarte y servirte, en salud o enfermedad, en tristeza y alegría, en riqueza o en pobreza, hasta que la muerte nos separe”.

En nuestra parroquia de San José, preparamos, guiamos y celebramos el sacramento del matrimonio con gran énfasis en la educación pre-matrimonial.

No nos limita al sacramento del matrimonio, notamos que en nuestra comunidad tenemos jóvenes y adultos que necesitan recibir los sacramentos de iniciación y tras un proceso de preparación que muchas veces resulta paralelo al pre- matrimonial, reciben todos los sacramentos de iniciación o uno de ellos.

En esta Semana Nacional de los Matrimonios, saludamos los ejemplares matrimonios de nuestra comunidad, como raíz de la familia e iglesia doméstica.

Les invito a rezar por las parejas casadas, interceder por los jóvenes que se preparan en los programas pre-matrimoniales y motivar a nuestros hijos a pensar en el significado único del matrimonio entre un hombre y una mujer como un signo de Cristo y su novia la Iglesia.

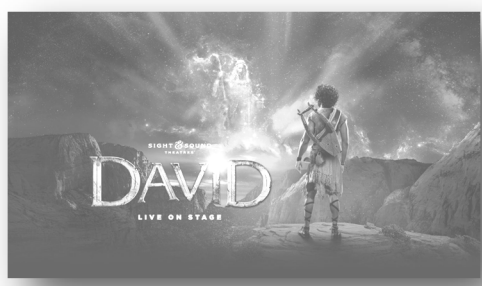
