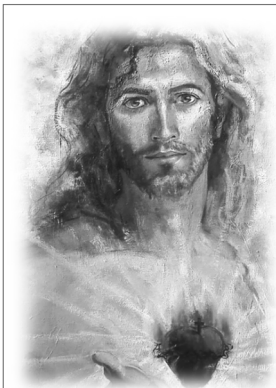

### Sunday Reflection

Recently I was thinking of St. Paul's phrase "there is now no condemnation for those in Christ." (Romans 8:1). What does that mean? When a mother looks at a son ruining his life, does that mean he can destroy the gift of his life and do whatever he would like? Could he murder, break hearts, manipulate, perhaps not out of the inertia of weakness or addiction but even the cold awareness of pride? That was something like the extreme and problematic position one of first protestant reformers, Martin Luther, took in defending the basic intuition that God's grace is unmerited and God's love unconditional. For Luther, who already on the other extreme of an insecure and scrupulous personality, always second-guessing how God saw him, always feeling restricted, sometimes going to confession many times in a week or day, we are like excrement covered with snow (Christ) and we can do anything we want knowing that we are "covered" like an insurance policy where don't have to do anymore works. This opposition between faith and works, is an unfortunate misunderstanding. In reality there is no such opposition. Works should flow from faith naturally from within, as an expression of faith, not to gain points or merit grace. It would be very strange if a husband really loved his wife and said so, but never expressed any affection or touch. One flows from the other. God does love us, infinitely more than the mother cries and continues loving her wayward son, whether our faith fluctuates due to pressures of life, or whether we live up to those precepts and commands put in place to help us avoid inner desolation, the lack of inner peace. God is a simple and unchanging act of love. Extremes touch, just as cold burns and heat cools. An extreme position like Luther's, just as the other extreme feeling we have to earn God's love, is based on fear, and obscures the inner transformation and freedom we have, the inner cooperation we have with grace that sometimes would like to meet us and use our worst sins for our growth into children of light. We always return to the model of the Prodigal Son, to whom God gave space to stumble and fall, and to us as sons he gives space to make sense of his own desires, for at times it is not our desire that is bad but the way we look to fulfill it. For those who try, even after a long period of not trying, for those of us who are simply weak and not placing a barrier of pride, there is no condemnation if we drink from the fount mercy.

### 2022 Lenten Regulations

1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.
2. On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted, **and two (2) smaller meals which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.**
3. Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.
4. On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.
5. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially", or as a whole, is a serious obligation.
6. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
7. The time for fulfilling the Paschal precept (Easter Duty\*) extends from the **First Sunday of Lent March 6 to the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, June 12.**

*\* Canon 920, 1. All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.*

### Reflexión del Domingo

Recientemente estaba pensando en la frase de San Pablo: "ahora no hay condenación para los que están en Cristo". (Romanos 8:1). ¿Que significa eso? Cuando una madre mira a un hijo destruyendo su vida, ¿acaso significa que ese hijo puede destruir el regalo de su vida y hacer lo que le da la gana? ¿Podría asesinar, romper corazones, manipular, quizás no por la inercia de la debilidad o la adicción, sino incluso por la fría conciencia del orgullo? Era algo parecido a la posición extrema y problemática que asumió uno de los primeros reformadores protestantes, Martín Lutero, al defender la intuición básica y correcta de que la gracia de Dios es inmerecida y el amor de Dios incondicional. Para Lutero, que ya estaba en el otro

extremo de una personalidad insegura y escrupulosa, siempre cuestionando cómo Dios lo veía, siempre sintiéndose restringido, a veces confesándose muchas veces en una semana o en un día, los Cristianos son como excremento cubierto de nieve (la gracia), y podemos hacer lo que queramos sabiendo que estamos "cubiertos" como una póliza de seguro donde no tenemos que hacer más obras. Esta oposición entre la fe y las obras es un desafortunado malentendido. En realidad no existe tal oposición. Las obras deben fluir de la fe naturalmente desde adentro, como una expresión de fe, no para ganar puntos o merecer la gracia. Sería muy extraño un esposo que realmente ama a su esposa y lo dice con palabras o fe, pero nunca expresa ningún afecto o toque de cariño. El uno fluye del otro. Dios nos ama, infinitamente más que esa madre que llora y sigue amando a su hijo drog-adicto, incluso cuando nuestra fe fluctúe por las presiones de la vida, o cuando no vivamos a la altura de los preceptos y mandatos divinos establecidos para ayudarnos a evitar la desolación interior, la falta de paz interior. Dios es un acto de amor simple e invariable. Los extremos se tocan, al igual que el frío quema y el calor enfría. Una posición extrema como la de Lutero, así como el otro extremo que tenemos de ganar el amor de Dios, se basa en el miedo desordenado, y oscurece la transformación interior y la libertad que tenemos, la cooperación interior que tenemos con la gracia que a veces quisiera encontrarnos y servirnos. Nuestros peores pecados para nuestro crecimiento como hijos de la luz. Siempre volvemos al modelo del Hijo Pródigo, a quien Dios le dio espacio para tropezar y caer, y a nosotros como hijos nos da espacio para dar sentido a nuestros propios deseos, porque a veces no es nuestro deseo lo que esta mal sino el forma en que buscamos cumplirlo, en este sentido muchos hispanos se equivocan a veces cuando hablan de "malos deseos." Para los que lo tratan de luchar, incluso después de un largo período de distancia con Dios o la Iglesia, para los que somos simplemente débiles y no ponemos una barrera de soberbia, no hay condenación si bebemos de la fuente de la misericordia.

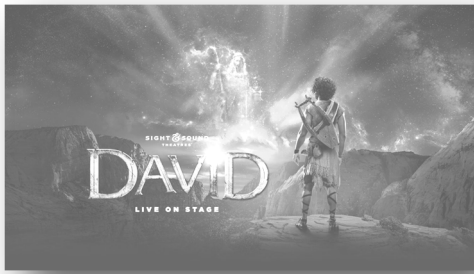

### Regulaciones de Cuaresma 2022

1. Los días de ayuno y abstinencia durante la Cuaresma son el miércoles de ceniza y el Viernes Santo. El ayuno del Viernes Santo puede continuar hasta la Vigilia Pascual para honrar el sufrimiento y la muerte del Señor Jesús. Los otros Viernes de Cuaresma son días de abstinencia.
2. En un día de ayuno, sólo se permite **una (1) comida completa, y dos (2) comidas más pequeñas, las cuales, si se suman, no excederían la comida principal en cantidad.**
3. Los que tienen entre 18 y 59 años de edad están obligados a ayunar.
4. En un día de abstinencia, no se puede comer carne. Los que han cumplido los 14 años están obligados por la ley de abstinencia.
5. La obligación de observar las leyes del Ayuno y Abstinencia “considerablemente” o completamente, es una obligación seria.
6. Los viernes del año fuera de la Cuaresma, están designados como días de penitencia, pero cada individuo puede substituir la abstinencia tradicional de la carne por otra práctica de penitencia voluntaria.
7. El tiempo para cumplir el Precepto Pascual se extiende desde el **primer domingo de Cuaresma, 6 de Marzo, hasta la Solemnidad de la Santa Trinidad, 12 de Junio.**

*Canon 920, 1: Todos los creyentes, después de ser iniciados a la Santísima Eucaristía, están comprometidos a recibir la Comunión por lo menos dos (2) veces al año.*
