THE ONE FOR WHOM OUR HEARTS LONG

Put yourself in the scene of today's Gospel passage. John the Baptist is in prison. He has heard stories of what Jesus is doing, and wants reassurance that Jesus is the long-awaited Messiah. John's disciples and those who surrounded Jesus were faithful Jews who would have known Isaiah's prophecies by heart. God would send One who would bring sight to the blind, healing to those who were ill, salvation to all who longed to know God's mercy and peace. Jesus' response to the disciples' question rings as powerfully in our ears today as it surely did for the people who were with him that day. His actions are precisely those that the people had been told to expect. Jesus is the One for whom the people have been patiently yet anxiously waiting, like the farmer who waits for the fruits of his labor. Jesus is the One for whom our hearts long.

Sunday's Reflection

Isaiah saw an Israel that no one else could see. Scripture scholars tell us that today's first reading was written when the Jewish people were allowed to return to Jerusalem after years in exile, but they found a city totally destroyed. But Isaiah saw flowers where his compatriots saw a barren desert. He saw the glory and splendor of God, and not the desecration of the temple. Courage! Do not be afraid," he tells his neighbors, for God will save them (Isaiah 35:4). There are times, and there will continue to be, when we look at the world, the nation, our community, and much of what we see makes us pessimistic or extremely desperate. But with the eyes of a prophet, with the eyes of faith, we can visualize "the splendor of our God" (35:2) that arises between fatality and sorrow.

But that is not easy. Let us look at John the Baptist. What happened to the child who jumped in his mother's womb in the presence of Mary? What happened to his memory of the Holy Spirit who came down like a dove when he baptized Jesus? What happened to the certainty we saw last week when he announced that the Kingdom was near? Perhaps the four walls of Herod's prison were like a barrier preventing him from having a deeper vision. Or perhaps he questioned why a Messiah who healed the blind and deaf, and even raised the dead, failed to free the prisoner. What happened to the proclamation of freedom to the captives? Had God abandoned him? Don't we ask ourselves the same question?

When James refers to "the coming of the Lord" in this passage (5:7) he speaks to us of the second coming of Jesus, but it can be applied to the presence of the Lord at any time. If it really "is near" (5:8), why is it that we do not see it? How come we can't feel it? "Be patient" is what James advises us (5:7). In today's world where communication, information, and entertainment are immediately available, patience and deep consideration are needed to recognize the Lord. In the midst of the busyness of these weeks before Christmas, let us take time to reflect on and discern the presence of the Lord in our lives.

Reflexión del Domingo

Isaías vio un Israel que nadie más podía ver. Los eruditos de las Sagradas Escrituras nos dicen que la primera lectura de hoy fue escrita cuando le fue permitido al pueblo judío regresar a Jerusalén después de años en exilio, pero se encontraron con una ciudad totalmente destruida. Pero Isaías vio flores donde sus compatriotas vieron un desierto yermo. Él vio la gloria y el esplendor de Dios, y no la profanación del templo. ¡Ánimo! No teman”, le dice a sus vecinos, pues Dios los salvará (Isaías 35, 4). Hay momentos, y seguirán habiéndolos, en que miramos al mundo, a la nación, a nuestra comunidad y mucho de lo que vemos nos hace ser pesimistas o sentirnos sumamente desesperados. Pero con los ojos de un profeta, con los ojos de la fe podemos visualizar “el esplendor de nuestro Dios” (35, 2) que surge entre la fatalidad y la pesadumbre.

Pero eso no es fácil. Fijémonos en Juan el Bautista. ¿Qué pasó con el niño que saltó en el vientre de su madre en presencia de María, que llevaba en su seno al Niño? ¿Qué pasó con su recuerdo del Espíritu Santo que bajó como una paloma cuando bautizó a Jesús? ¿Qué pasó con la certeza que vimos la semana pasada cuando anunció que el Reino estaba cerca? Tal vez las cuatro paredes de la prisión de Herodes fueron como una barrera evitando que él tuviera una visión más profunda. O tal vez cuestionó por qué un Mesías que curaba a los ciegos y a los sordos, y hasta resucitaba a los muertos no logró liberar al prisionero. ¿Qué pasó con proclamar la libertad a los cautivos? ¿Acaso lo había abandonado Dios? ¿Acaso no nos preguntamos lo mismo nosotros?

Cuando Santiago se refiere a “la venida del Señor” en este pasaje (5, 7) nos habla de la segunda venida de Jesús, pero puede aplicarse a la presencia del Señor en cualquier momento. Si de verdad “está cerca” (5, 8), ¿por qué es que no lo vemos? ¿Cómo es que no podemos sentirlo? “Sean pacientes” es lo que nos aconseja Santiago (5, 7). En el mundo de hoy donde la comunicación, la información y el entretenimiento están al alcance inmediato, se necesita paciencia y profunda consideración para reconocer al Señor. En medio de las ocupaciones de estas semanas antes de la Navidad, dediquémosle tiempo a reflexionar y discernir la presencia del Señor en nuestra vida.
