ORDINARY TIME

A NEW TIME TO GROW AND LOVE

Dear Brothers in the Lord, Life and Love:

Greetings and many blessings in this new and beautiful year that has begun, one that the Lord has given us with His immense goodness and mercy.

We begin a new year that will bring new challenges and joys to live through. Everything new is unknown and sometimes produces insecurity, but it also brings in its novelty the expectation that encourages and motivates us to face and feel that each new thing is an opportunity to learn, grow and love.

Liturgically speaking, we begin a new year and with it we enter the "Ordinary Time", a particular time in which we will walk with the Lord Jesus; letting ourselves be impacted by his words, teachings, miracles, signs and blessings.

On this Second Sunday of Ordinary Time we see that the Gospel tells us the story of the Wedding at Cana, where we know it as the first sign that Jesus makes in this Gospel.

In this Gospel we see a magnificent and primordial participation of the Virgin Mary. There is Mary, The Mother, attentive and mediator. In the words of Pope Francis:

"It is nice to hear this, Mary is Mother. Do you dare to say it all together with me? Again: Mary is Mother, again: Mary is Mother. But Mary, at that moment when she realizes that the wine is missing, goes with confidence to Jesus. This means that Mary prays. She goes to Jesus, and prays. She does not go to the steward; she directly presents the difficulty of the spouses to her Son. The answer she receives seems daunting: "What can you and I do? My hour has not yet come" (Jn 2.4:4). But in the meantime, she has already left the problem in God's hands. Her haste for the needs of others hastens the "hour" of Jesus.

And Mary is part of that hour, from the manger to the cross. She who knew how to "transform a cave of animals into the house of Jesus, with poor swaddling clothes and a mountain of tenderness" (Evangelii Gaudium, 286) and received us as children when a sword pierced her Son's heart, teaches us to leave our families in God's hands; she teaches us to pray, kindling the hope that our worries are also God's concerns."

So we begin this new year inspired by this beautiful story and this great teaching of the Wedding at Cana. And as I said a few days ago it is very important to start the year with purposes; we will put our best attitude, our "new suit" and prepare our heart, thoughts and our whole being with a positive attitude, beautiful, clean, "new" and with the best wishes for each of us and all those around us.

From the hand of Mary, our Mother and Mother of God, who also accompanied her son Jesus in this first sign, we put each of our requests, longings and desires, so that our Blessed Mother, as in those weddings, intercedes for us and covers us with her mantle in this new cycle and throughout this 2023.

OUR FASCINATING FAITH

Calendars

Perhaps you noticed that this year we didn't celebrate the Baptism of the Lord on the Sunday after Epiphany (today), but instead on last Monday, the day after Epiphany. Why the shift? It all has to do with regional calendars. Within certain general boundaries, every national conference of bishops is able to set its own liturgical calendar according to how it is felt to benefit the people in that region most. So, for example, the Epiphany of the Lord is celebrated January 6 on the Church's universal calendar. But the bishops of the United States decided that, for the benefit of the faithful, it would be better for Epiphany to be celebrated on a Sunday every year. So here in the States we see Epiphany's date vary from January 2 to January 8. The biggest problem this presents is that the Baptism of the Lord, which is normally celebrated on the Sunday after the Epiphany, would push back the whole liturgical calendar by a week on the years when the Sunday celebration of the Epiphany falls on January 7 or 8, putting the U.S. out of sync with the rest of the Catholic world at least until Lent. To avoid that scenario, the U. S. bishops decreed that in those years the Baptism of the Lord would fall on the Monday after Epiphany, leaving the rest of the calendar intact.

OUR STRATEGIC GOAL

As a Church, we now move into Ordinary Time. "Ordinary" comes from the Latin root for "order," which is why we line the Sundays up on the calendar and count them—with "ordinal" numbers—one by one. The orderly way we proceed through the liturgical year reminds us that our faith offers a strategic goal for our lives: eternal happiness with God, who is love. Today's readings share stories of believers who order their daily activities toward the goal of sharing God's love. Isaiah embraces his role as God's servant and works to bring glory not only to Israel, but to the entire world. In a similar way, Saint Paul identifies himself as Christ's witness in the world and reminds the Corinthians of their life goal: "to be holy." The Gospel shows us John the Baptist, servant and witness, attentive to God's loving orders, the divine plan for salvation.

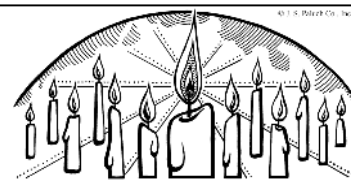

UN NUEVO CICLO PARA CRECER Y AMAR.

Queridos Hermanos en el Señor la Vida y el Amor, un saludo y muchas bendiciones en este nuevo y bello año que hemos empezado, y que el Señor nos regala con su inmensa bondad y misericordia.

Empezamos un nuevo año y con este nuevo año llegaran nuevos retos, desafíos y alegrías por vivir. Todavía no ha llegado mi hora» (Jn 2,4). Pero, entre tanto, ya ha dejado el problema en las manos de Dios. Su apuro por las necesidades de los demás, apresura la «hora» de Jesús.

Y María es parte de esa hora, desde el pesebre a la cruz. Ella que supo «transformar una cueva de animales en la casa de Jesús, con unos pobres pañales y una montaña de ternura» (Evangelii gaudium, 286) y nos recibió como hijos cuando una espada le atravesaba el corazón a su Hijo, Ella nos enseña a dejar nuestras familias en manos de Dios; nos enseña a rezar, encendiendo la esperanza que nos indica que nuestras preocupaciones también son preocupaciones de Dios".

Así que iniciamos este nuevo año nuevo inspirándonos con este hermoso relato y esta gran enseñanza de la Bodas de Cana. Y como dije unos días atrás es muy importante arrancar el año con nuestros propósitos; vamos a poner nuestra mejor actitud, nuestro "traje nuevo" y preparar nuestro corazón, pensamiento y todo nuestro ser con actitud positiva, bonita, limpia, "nueva" y con los mejores deseos para cada uno de nosotros y todos los que nos rodean.
