The Catechesis instills in us the foundations of the Christian life and apostolic commitment through a basic education of the faith that is open to all of the dimensions of Christian life (knowledge of the faith, liturgical education, moral formation, learning of prayer, initiation in community life and apostolate).

"From their earliest youth, children have a need for God, because since the dawn of his creation, man has needed God. Parents have to educate their children, from as early as possible, in the true sense of love." (Benedict XVI) Parents need to see adolescents as sincere, loyal and faithful friends; just as teens need to see parents as responsible and mature people who care about them. The family is where "the first and deepest foundations of psychological and moral attitudes are placed" (John Paul II).

St. Joseph of the Palisades Church supports the parent's work. In the coming weeks we will celebrate the Sacraments of First Communion and Confirmation of our children. "From childhood to the threshold of maturity, catechesis becomes a permanent school of faith and as it follows the great stages of life as a beacon that illuminates the path of the child, the adolescent and the young adult." 
Donations still accepted
